



The objectives include creating awareness among students about the neighborhood, sensitizing students to offer social work, to sensitize students to the predicaments and problems of aged people and become aware of the joy of serving and being with the aged

The students of MBA were on 17th April 2015. The students were divided into two teams and each team was sent to two different places, one batch went to infant Jesus home and the other batch to Home of Hope. The organization takes those people who are on the streets and looks after and provides the basic things for them. On average, they get 5 persons per day. At present, the organization consists of 168 people. It was a great privilege for students to be a part of this organization for a day. Students had interaction with all those inmates who were present there and a few of them sang few devotional songs and also did few programs like dance and action. Students also visited the children's home that was associated with Home of Hope. MBA students met children who are not so fortunate enough and they are looked after by this organization. They distributed chocolates for them.

The experience was, without a shadow of a doubt, a very rewarding and fulfilling activity. It was an afternoon spent between fun and games and getting to know the children and making them smile. This indeed was a great experience. By the end of the visit, the students had learned most of their names and vice-versa.
