Report on CSA Camp

Centre for Social Activities of Kristu Jayanti College had organised Rural Exposure Camp from 10th to 13th December, 2015 at E-Thimsandra, Shiddalagatta Taluk, Chikkaballapura Dist. The objective of the Camp was to enable students understand the Socio-Economic and Cultural conditions of rural life and to help students integrate essential values for life.

The Camp was inaugurated by Mr. Srikantha, Judge, JMFC Court, Shiddalagatta. Legal Awareness Program was conducted by Mr. Papireddy, President of the Lawyers Association, Shiddalagatta Taluk. Various programs were conducted by volunteers with topics like Swachh Bharat, Life Skills and sports to government school students and dengue campaign to villagers. There was a socioeconomic survey of the current rural lifestyle. Team building activities were organized in order to develop the inter-personal relationships among volunteers. On 12th December, Fr. Josekutty P D, the Principal and Fr. Lijo P Thomas, Financial Administrator accompanied by Dr. Shreedhar P D and Mr. Manjunath S visited the Camp site and appreciated the volunteers for their dedication, commitment and selflessness for the greater good. Dr. Venkatachalapathy, Associate Professor, Dept. of Agronomy, of GKVK College addressed villagers about Dry irrigation where farmers gained knowledge on the practical approach on cultivation through dry irrigation.

On 13th of December, a Valedictory Ceremony was held to appreciate the students who won in sports and also to thank the villagers for their constant support. This Camp not only helped in development of the village and its people but also inculcated the spirit of team work, honesty and hard work among the Jayantians.

- 1. Swachchh Bharat: This was the first event that was being held in the Camp, where all the CSA volunteers including the faculty coordinators cleaned the entire surrounding of village. The villagers were also inspired by this and helped in the cleaning. This brought a very good change in the minds of the villagers as well as the volunteers. Volunteers really worked hard and completed the event.
- 2. Farm Visit: The farm visit benefited both the locals the volunteers as well. They came to know the importance of planting trees and the uses of it.
- 3. Games for School children: Games and fun were conducted in the village for the school children who actively participated in all the games that were conducted by the volunteers and were given prizes.

- 4. Survey: This was an important event in the Camp that was held in the evening by the Student Coordinators and volunteers. The villagers also actively participated and shared their details that helped in providing necessary information.
- 5. Rangoli: This was also conducted by our volunteers and the faculty co-ordinators where the women and young girls actively participated in this competition and they were rewarded with prizes later.
- 6. Cultural Programme: This was conducted by the faculty and student coordinators and volunteers.
- 7. Awareness on Farming: The resource person with his own interest explained about the safety to the villagers which provided knowledge about farming to the villagers and the volunteers as well.
- 8. Dengue Campaign: This Campaign was organized by volunteers to give knowledge on social responsibilities and their health, where school students also joined hands with the volunteers to make the campaign successful.
- 9. Life Skills: It was a skill development class for the school children to develop their life and social responsibilities.







The Five-day Dengue Awareness Program from Thursday, July 30th 2015 to Monday, August 3rd 2015 was conducted by the NSS Unit of Kristu Jayanti College. The students were accompanied by the staff coordinators. This Awareness Program was conducted in the neighborhood villages which included Narayanapura, Geddalahalli, Nagenahalli, Kothanur and Byrathi.



The doctors from the Government Hospital also accompanied the students in this program. They explained to the public about the Aedis Mosquito and showed them the "Larva" which emerges from the egg of Aedis Mosquito.



Students visited each house and especially slum areas and imparted awareness among the people who were unaware of these Dengue situations and also informed them about the Dengue fever, its severe effects and how to tackle these situations in a simplified manner so that they could remain safe.

The Awareness Program included around 400 students from the NSS Unit and around 100 houses were covered each day. This program reached about 3000 people. A survey was also conducted by the students to count the number of tanks present at each house and whether larva was found in those tanks or that they were clean.

Apart from this, the students found a number of open dirty water channels outside many houses where water got accumulated. People also complained that BBMP was really slow in taking steps to close those channels. There were also cases where people blamed BBMP where they could have easily taken some decisions in the area to keep their roads and the open water channels clean.

The program conducted by the NSS Team was really appreciated by the locals. The Program was headed by the NSS Program officer Dr. Shreedhar Pd., Prof. Prathap, Prof. Nayazpasha, Prof. Vinod, Prof. Kalyani and Prof. Priya.

are more than 250 people here and most of them are from the streets. I extend my heartfelt thanks to the NSS Unit that I could really feel the Independence with these people".

REPORT ON Leprosy Disease Awareness Campaign

Theme: Health and Hygiene

The Two-Day Leprosy Disease Awareness Campaign was organized by NSS Unit of Kristu Jayanti College on 27/2/16 and 28/02/2016. The students along with the support of the staff coordinators organized this campaign in the neighborhood: Narayanpura, Nagenahalli, and Tanisandra.

Doctors from the nearby Government Hospital also took the initiative to visit the people with the students and explained to them about Leprosy which is also known as "Hansen's disease." It is a chronic infection caused by the bacteria Mycobacterium leprae and Mycobacterium lepromatosis. Students went to each house and especially slum areas and imparted awareness among a number of people who were unaware of leprosy and also informed them about leprosy causes, its severe effects and how to tackle these situations in an easy simplified manner so that they could remain safe. Volunteers explained and gave information about the disease, how it spreads, which are the most effective places, how can one be safe from this disease, what are the symptoms of leprosy and also informed them of the precautionary measures that have to be taken.

The campaign included around 400 volunteers and around 300 houses were covered each day with around 3000 people. A survey was also conducted by the students to count the number of members present at each house and whether they were effected by leprosy or not.

Volunteers clarified doubts regarding leprosy treatment that leprosy is curable with treatment known as Multidrug therapy (MDT). This initiative was greatly appreciated by the locals. The Program was headed by the NSS Program Officer Dr. Sreedhar Pd., Prof. Prathap, Prof. Nayazpasha, Prof. Vinod, Prof. Kalyani and Prof. Priya.


ROAD SAFETY AWARENESS PROGRAM
