



Date: 23/07/2016

Classes Attended: 270 CSA Volunteers

No. of Beneficiaries: Approximately 850 (those living around Hedge Nagar)

Objective:

- To Examine and explain the growing significance of dengue and dengue hemorrhagic fever in public health
- To focus on effective prevention and risk reduction strategies
- To emphasize the practical application measures to control dengue

Brief Write Up on the Programme:

An awareness campaign on dengue fever and mosquito control measures was organized by the Centre for Social Activities of Kristu Jayanti College in association with the Primary Health Centre, K Narayanapura, on 23rd July 2016 at Hegde Nagar.

CSA volunteers gathered near Hegde Nagar at around 2.00 PM and were divided into 15 groups. Mr. Amarnath, representative from the PHC, K Narayanapura, explained about the Aedis Mosquito and showed the "Larva" which emerges from the egg of the Aedis Mosquito. The campaign was led by staff coordinators Mr. Manjunath S, Mr. Chandrashekar, Mr. Ragavendra Babu and Dr. AJ Excelce.

Around 270 CSA volunteers covered 825 households. The volunteers were successful in spreading awareness about the growing habitats of dengue around. People were informed about the preventive measures and were encouraged to adopt repellant methods to fight against such viral diseases. A survey was also done to check whether larva was found in tanks. This campaign will help to instill the values of civic sense and societal commitment among students.

Objective:

The objective of the camp was to enable the students to understand the socio-economic and cultural conditions of rural life and to help the students integrate essential values for life.

Brief Write Up on the Programme:

The Centre for Social Activities of Kristu Jayanti College organised Rural Exposure Camp from 18th to 21st December 2016 at Byalahalli Village, Kolar taluk & district. The camp was organized with the theme "Enhancing Social Leadership" to provide an opportunity to the students to have an experiential learning and to inculcate leadership qualities.







Title: Medical Camp **Date:** 18/03/2017

Beneficiaries: Byalahalli Villagers

Objective:

- To identify people with cataract and provide them with surgical treatment for sight restoration
- To screen people for refractive error problems
- To screen for other major causes of vision impairment and to provide treatment for minor ailments
- To make eye care community oriented

Brief Write up on the Programme:

On the camp day, a team of doctors, refractionists, lab technicians and assistants proceed to the camp spot. Patients identified with cataracts were transported to hospital. The prime purpose of conducting eye camps is to provide high volume, high quality and low cost eye care service to the rural population of the target area, through mobile camp approach that is accessible, affordable and appropriate. Cataract, being a leading cause of blindness, the focus of our camps is to identify and treat people with cataracts. The service also includes providing correction for refractive errors, treating diseases like ulcers, and referring patients requiring institutional diagnosis and treatment to the base hospital (patients with Glaucoma, Retinopathy, etc.).

A CSA alumni group of 6 were also present on that day, who donated a television to the Byalahalli Government School.




Objective: The main objective of tree plantation was to create awareness among cadets towards environmental protection.





Objective: To pay tribute to the freedom fighters and to nourish the young children by offering them their needs and wants.




