Report on Swachhata Pakhwada

Date: 01.09.2017, 14.09.2017 & 16.09.2017

Number of beneficiaries: 100 CSA Volunteers

Objective:

To spread Swachhata Pakhwada awareness among students

To sensitize and ensure good health and hygiene

To promote good practices as part of enhancing cleanliness

To create a safe, healthy, clean and green environment

Brief Write up on the Programme:

The "Swachhata Pakhwada" programme, as part of Swachh Bharath Abhiyan, was organized by Centre for Social Activities of Kristu Jayanti College from 1st September 2017 to 15th September 2017. The three events initiated as part of the national campaign were conducted on 1st, 14th and 16th September.

On September 1st around 60 CSA volunteers gathered at the car parking lot at 3.30 pm for the inauguration of "Swachhata Pakhwada". The students were divided into 6 groups and were given necessary instructions by the faculty members and student coordinators. Each group was given a garbage bag. The groups were sent to different places of the college like CCD, bike parking lot, basketball ground, cafeteria, different parts of the parking area etc. By 4.15 pm, the student groups returned with the garbage collected and it was segregated and finally disposed of. Rev. Fr. Som Zacharias inaugurated the campaign. The staff coordinators Mr. Manjunath S, Mr. Chandrashekar and, Mr. Ragavendra Babu, Dr. A J Excelce and Ms. Preethi S J G led the function. NSS and NCC volunteers also attended the function.

On September 14th the cleaning campaign was conducted at the Government hospital K. Narayanapura. The CSA volunteers were asked to assemble at the Government hospital at 3.30. The students were divided into groups of 10 and were assigned the task of cleaning the entire premises. Among the wastes collected, the plastic wastes were separated and disposed of. A brief



lecture was given to the volunteers on how to recycle plastic wastes and problems caused by mosquitoes and pollution. The program invoked in the students the need of the hour to keep the public places like hospitals clean. Many staff coordinators encouraged the students with their presence.

On September 16th the quadrangle of Kristu Jayanti College witnessed the grand valedictory function at 12.45. It was attended by numerous CSA volunteers and teachers. The Principal Rev. Fr. Josekutty P D delivered the valedictory message. He urged the need for keeping the surroundings clean and green. 





Brief Write up on the Programme:

DAY 1 [30/11/2017]

INAUGURATION

The camp was inaugurated by the chief guest Sri. Ventaramanappa, Block Education Officer, Gudibande taluk, Chikaballapura district. The program started with a prayer song followed by lightening of lamp. Later the chief guest shared his opinion about doing social services and its impact on society. LIFE SKILL PROGRAM


Objective:





To create awareness about garbage segregation and recycling and educating environmental issues.

Brief Write-up:

Swaach Pakwad is an event to educate and make awareness about environmental issues. On 15th September 2017, Kristu Jayanti College gave an opportunity for NCC cadets to visit a garbage dumping yard and gain knowledge about garbage segregation and recycling. Waste is not a behaviour that most city dwellers are familiar with. It may be possible to bring a more substantive shift in thinking and behaviour towards waste by integrating environment education centre on solid waste management beginning at the elementary level.

The garbage segregation process educates that organic and dry waste should be segregated accordingly while depositing waste. A visit to GRACE waste collection centre where the cadets learnt on segregation and recycling of waste, where a huge amount of waste is collected every day, which has to be disposed of carefully and recycled for further reuse.

Waste is segregated into organic, dry and sanitary waste, to make it convenient for dumping and recycling. A daily report is made of whatever waste is used for recycled or whatever waste is dump into the sand and how much waste is sold.
























Report on Dengue awareness and Rainwater Harvesting




Day 5


Day 7

- After the valedictory session, the Literary and Cultural committee of our college presented a guest performance for the NSS unit.




