Introduction

In accordance with the Risk-Based Audit and Evaluation Plan of Kristu Jayanti College for 2017-18, the Audit and Evaluation Team of International Institute of Waste Management, conducted a Green/Environmental audit of the college for the period 2017-18. The purpose of the audit was to ensure that the practices followed in the campus are in accordance with the Green Policy adopted by the institution. With this in mind, the specific objectives of the audit were to evaluate the adequacy of the management control framework of Environment Sustainability as well as the degree to which the Departments are in compliance with the applicable regulations, policies and standards.

During the initial planning of the audit, the previous audits and its recommendations were examined by the audit team and an analysis was conducted in order to identify, evaluate and prioritize the risks associated with the environmental sustainability. The analysis was based upon an examination of the policies, manuals and standards that govern the environmental sustainability prevailing currently, on data analysis, and on the results of preliminary interviews with personnel considered key in the environmental management in the campus. The criteria and methods used in the audit were based on the identified risks. The methodology used included physical inspection of the campus, review of the relevant documentation, and interviews.

Summary of Findings

The main findings of the audit show that, in general, all the departments and students are aware about the need for environmental protection at a general level. It was also observed that a number of best practices such as maintaining good <u>Green cover with variety of plant species</u>, <u>Rainwater Harvesting</u>, <u>Paper Waste Recycling</u> is in place and functioning very well in the campus. <u>There are several best practices followed by the college in the adopted village</u>, <u>which is extremely commendable</u>.

It was also observed that the College is planning to establish a Sewage Treatment Plant in the campus. The work is in progress and a detailed survey by the Staff to establish this STP was also undertaken. Report given in the following chapters.

However, on detailed review, it was observed that, there are several lacunae in the college in implementing Green Compliance. In addition, certain processes could benefit from further review in order to improve their efficiency, fairness and consistency.



Objectives and Scope

The purpose of this audit was to ensure that the Environment Compliance is followed and implemented in the campus, across all departments, administrative bodies and students.


Methodology

In order to meet its objectives, this audit combined physical inspection with a review of relevant documentation and interviews with various stakeholders. Review of the previous Documentation was also undertaken. For the purpose of this audit the Management was also consulted to understand the future plans. Interviews were conducted with the Principal, faculty members and students. Physical Inspection was carried out by the team. The audit team was in the college to inspect the campus.

Key Highlight

The 2016-17 Audit had recommended that it is critical to establish a Sewage Treatment Plant for the campus. Hence, a detailed survey was carried out by the students. The contour survey map of the campus was used to check the sewage generation points. The storm water drainage pattern was studied to find out if any grey water is mixed with the storm water. Several iterations were done and finally two locations were identified to establish the Sewage Treatment Plant. A detailed report is annexed regarding the STP.

Technology Transfer from Lab to Field (2017-18)

1. Title of the Practice

Biofertilizers are the efficient alternatives that are eco-friendly and have beneficial effect on reclamation of soil, improving the yield and quality of the crop. Hence, a study on the use of biofertilizers was made in the field provided by Alamba charitable trust, Gubbi Cross, Bangalore Rural district of Karnataka; to evaluate the efficacy of biofertilizer consortium developed in the Biotechnology Research Laboratory of Kristu Jayanti College.

2. Objectives of the Practice

To improve the practice of using biofertilizer, an environmentally friendly substitute for harmful chemical fertilizers with particular reference to quality, carriers, consortia and delivery systems.

3. The Context

Yield was good, plants were healthy without pests and diseases.

4. The Practice

The beneficial microorganisms such as *Rhizobium sp.*, *Azotobacter sp.*, *Trichoderma sp.* and phoshosphobacteria were isolated, mass produed, mixed in



right proportions and injected into the carrier material (peat) to prepare biofertilizer consortium.

5. Evidence of Success

So far 65 days were over after sowing. The vegetable crops started yielding and the first harvest was done.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

Sufficient water facility was not there, regular monitoring and watering were found to be difficult. Because it's far away from our college. So we suggest that if we get a small plot of land from our college it would be useful to access and monitor nearby.





Objectives:


- To develop among the youth the awareness about the need of protecting plants



programme was arranged where Guest singer Mr. Rangaswamy entertained the students by his performance.




Day 7


Date: 17.11.2017

- After the valedictory session, the Literary and Cultural committee of our college presented guest performance for the NSS unit.














<u>Day 8</u>
