BACKGROUND

International Institute of Waste Management (IIWM) has been promoting the concept of 'Green Campus' to inculcate the sustainable value systems among the students, so that they carry the learnings and practices with them in their future endeavours. This will ensure that Sustainability and Environmental practices get embedded in all the institutions and organizations in the country. Kristu Jayanti College has expressed interest in conducting a Green Campus Certification programme for its campus.

This report is a precursor to the certification process. The Rating and Certification is planned for the academic year 2019-20. IIWM has been carrying out Environment/Green Audits for the KJC since 2015.

INTRODUCTION

A nation's growth starts from its educational institutions, where the ecology is thought as a prime factor of development associated with environment. A clean and healthy environment aids effective learning and provides a conducive learning environment. To preserve the environment within the campus, various viewpoints are applied by the several educational institutes to solve their environmental problems such as promotion of the energy savings, recycle of waste, water reduction, water harvesting etc.. The activities pursued by colleges can also create a variety of adverse environmental impacts.

Environmental auditing is a process whereby an organisation's environmental performance is tested against its environmental policies and objectives. Green audit is defined as an official examination of the effects a college has on the environment. As a part of such practice, internal environmental audit (Green Audit) is conducted to evaluate the actual scenario at the campus.

OBJECTIVIES

The main objectives of Green Campus Audit is to assess the environment management and sustainability concepts practiced in the college campus. The Specific objectives of Green campus audit are:

- To systematically identify the environmental aspects and components within the campus
- To quantify, record and analyse the identified aspects and components of environmental diversity of the campus.
- To deduce the impact of the environmental practices caused within and outside of the concerned campus.



- To establish baseline data or compare the past trends and predict future impacts
- To recommend possible measures for improvement and highlight best practices

METHODOLOGY

The methodology adopted for this Green Campus Audit has been as follows:

Physical inspection of the campus, observation and review of the documentation, interviewing key persons and data analysis, measurements and recommendations were the process adopted in the process of audit report preparation.

SCOPE OF WORK

The study covered the following area to summarize the present status of environment management in the campus.

Water conservation aspects of the campus

Waste management and other resource conservation of the campus

Wastewater/ Sewage Treatment and Recycling within the campus

Biodiversity enhancement within the campus

This Environment Audit Report is prepared by examining all the data provided by the college and physical verification of the data whereever possible. The analysis is interpreted in the Environment framework and reported under each of the above aspects delineated. ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Kristu Jayanti College, founded in 1999, is managed by "BODHI NIKETAN TRUST", formed by the members of St. Joseph Province of the Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (CMI). The College is affiliated to Bengaluru North University and is reaccredited with grade 'A' in 2015 by NAAC in the Second Cycle of Accreditation. The College is recognized by UGC under the category 2(f) & 12B. The College was accorded Autonomous Status from 2013. For its contribution in the field of Education, Kristu Jayanti College was recently given the Heroes of Bengaluru award. In the India Today - MDRA survey 2019, Kristu Jayanti College, Bengaluru is awarded as the Best Emerging College of the Century at National Level and the college is ranked 6th Best BCA, 12th Best MSW, 19th Best Arts, 21st Best Commerce, 21st Best BBA and 26th Best Science College in India. The College also ranked 2nd Best in BCA & MSW, 3rd best in Commerce, 4th Best in Arts & Science and 6th best in BBA among the colleges in Bengaluru.



STUDENT INVOLVEMENT IN THE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAMMES OF THE CAMPUS- ASPECT 2

The list of programmes and projects undertaken by the college for the said audit period was examined. Programmes which had environment or ecological agenda were delineated and examined for the effectiveness. The result of such an analysis is provided as Annexure 1- Beyond the campus activities

- The Environment Club in the College is a good practice adopted which is proof
 of the student involvement.
- The said audit period had about 11 programmes which are directly linked to environment aspects and enhancing the greenness of the campus.
- Awareness of the students have increased due to such campus programmes, which is imperative
- The students have participated in several inter college environment competitions, which also proves the student involvement in green initiatives, encouraged by the college
- Students have participated in activities in the community like Anti-plastic campaign in the college adopted village, which shows the commitment beyond the campus

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT OF THE COLLEGE WITH TOPICS RELATED TO ENVIRONMENT – ASPECT 3

The college has adopted a 5 Villages for community engagement. The programmes undertaken as part of the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan by the college was good. The programme was Environment Awareness for the community, focused on 'Antiplastics', discouraging plastic carry bags. A detailed report is **Annexure 1 section 2**

WATER CONSERVATION MEASURES

The water source for the campus are two bore wells (more than 1000 feet). The campus has adopted Rain water harvesting measures, which is very impressive. About 70% of the water consumption of the campus is undertaken through harvested rain water. For safe drinking water, RO plants are installed in canteen. The RO reject water is let into the drain. Currently no waste water recycling is practiced. The water consumption per day in the campus is 6,75,000 litres per day.

However, in summer, with these measures, the campus is still not able to manage its requirement. Hence, an additional source through a tanker from outside is bought to take care of the needs of campus activities.

The total water consumption benchmark for a campus without residential students staying on the campus, is 45 litres per day per person. The consumption of water in Kristu Jayanti College for the year 2018-19 is found to be double the benchmark.



Hence, there is an immediate requirement for reduction in consumption/ arrest loss of water through plugging leakages. Water conservation measures should be adopted immediately.

WASTE MANAGEMENT

The Waste Generated from the campus has been estimated as 30-40 kilograms per day. At present there is no proper waste management facility in place and the waste generated is being handed over to the municipality on daily basis at a rate of Rs.4000 per month. The quantification of waste is not practiced. Segregation of waste is undertaken. There is a separate composting facility for leaf litter and it is being used for the herbal garden. A proposal to set up biogas plant for the hostels outside the campus is being proposed. There are several dustbins in the campus and therefore, the cleanliness in the campus is quite good.

The total waste generation benchmark for a campus without residential students staying on the campus, is 0.05 kgs per day per person. There is no clear quantification of waste generated in the college. Immediate action needs to be taken for quantification of the segregated waste.

WASTE WATER MANAGEMENT

The wastewater generated in the college campus is treated in campus and is used for watering of garden. The Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) capacity is 90 Kilo liters per day, which is for the main blocks. The technology used is Sequential Batch Reactor system which has tertiary treatment and is used back for flushing purpose (yet to be commissioned). The wastewater generated in the rest of the building is treated by individual septic tanks and soak pits. There is a plan to install another wastewater treatment plant.

The sewage treatment plant is maintained by M/s Aqua Purification Systems, Bangalore. The treatment plant caters for a demand for 5000 Students. There is a deficit and hence, needs attention.

The quantity of wastewater generated in the campus is assessed as per IS standards (IS 9868/1981) which is 45 litres per day per person.

BIODIVERSITY ENHANCEMENT

The campus is home to variety of indigenous plants and trees. Every year new varieties of plants and trees are being planted and nurtured. There are three full time gardeners. A medicinal plant garden is maintained by the environment club students and the species and medicinal uses of plants have been labeled and documented. The department of Life Sciences has taken the initiative to map the species of flora in



the campus. A vegetable garden and nursery is also maintained in the campus. The complete list of medicinal plants have been attached as <u>Annexure</u>. Total campus area is 8.5 acres, out of which the green cover is about 2.8 acres

GREEN POLICIES AND MANAGEMENT

The college assesses the environmental impact of the institution and takes necessary measures to promote consciousness, preservation and protection of the environment. The college has valid documented and well circulated green policies.

Kristu Jayanti College organizes Social outreach programme every year for the second year undergraduate students

The objectives of the programme

- To aid the poor and the marginalized and contribute to the integral development within the capabilities of the college in order to meet their physical and psychological needs.
- To sensitize students about the realities of the society and to develop people oriented attitude and concern for others





RECOMMENDATIONS

Management Commitment

•Environment Policy for the College: Although there is a mention of the environment aspects in the college's "Infrastructure and maintenance Policy" – which states that – "Utilisation of renewable energy resources by harnessing rainwater and solar energy and sewage water treatment", "Aim for zero percentage wastage through effective wet and dry waste management", "Create and maintain a green certified campus", it is important for the College to highlight its Eco-friendliness by drafting a separate 'Environment Policy' which is inclusive and action oriented.

Management Commitment

•The College should be proud of its Eco-infrastructure and display the same with its eco-friendliness in the website upfront. The saving potential and carbon friendliness needs to be showcased. Its targets for improvement also should be put forth.

Student involvement

•Involvement of Students in Eco-Infrastructure projects to maintain the college infrastructure and evaluating the existing infrastructure should be undertaken

Community Involvement

•The community programmes should be designed which is long term, which should see the physical changes in the villages which are tangible and carried out by different departments with same thread. For example, Water conservation activity in the village for three years with clear target of increasing the water harvesting area and structures in the village. The results can thus be physically measured.

Water conservation

- The water harvesting structure installed should have a water level meter installed. A water audit spreadsheet should be maintained by the college with clear target set annually for conservation measures.
- Taps in the toilets should be replaced with air pressured water conservation measures.

Waste management

- •Composting of food waste from the canteens to be undertaken
- No single use plastic within the campus to be made as a policy in the campus. Boards banning single use plastic to be displayed in the campus in prominent places
- •Weighing machine with segregation of waste, which is digitised to be installed in the college. This will enable the college to adhere to the 'Smart and Clean campus' parameter. This will also capture the various waste streams of the campus like E-Waste, Recyclables like glass, rejects, organic waste etc., on a real time basis and help in setting targets for reduction. Resource efficiency can be proven using this measure

Wastewater management

- Recycling of the treated water should be undertaken.
- •Installation of DTS (decentralised wastewater treatment system) for the standalone new buildings to be undertaken.



Bio-diversity conservation

- •Develop entrepreneurship through student involvement with the medicinal plant cultivation
- •The current research activities involved with medicinal plants to be linked with Ministry of Ayush through World Ayurveda Foundation to take it to the community.

Energy Management

- •Newer buildings to be constructed to be made according to Green Building concepts
- •Any new infrastructure to be added to follow the guidelines of green material management



DEPARTMENT OF LIFESCIENCES TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER FROM LAB TO FIELD (2018-19)

Title of the Practice

Biofertilizers can be expected to reduce the use of synthetic fertilizers and pesticides. The microorganisms in biofertilizers restore the soil's natural nutrient cycle and build soil organic matter. Through the use of biofertilizers, healthy plants can be grown, while enhancing the sustainability and the health of the soil can be restored. One of the major advantages of such fertilizer is that it does not harm the environment or in other words it's environment-friendly.

Hence the present study was made to evaluate the efficacy of biofertilizer consortium developed in the Biotechnology Research Laboratory of Kristu Jayanti College and tested in field provided by Alamba charitable trust, Gubbicross, Bangalore Rural district of Karnataka;

Objectives

- ✓ An alternative eco-friendly approach to sustainable agricultural practices shifting the crop field practices to use of organic fertilizers and microbial biofertilizers.
- ✓ To increases the close associations of many bacteria and fungi with the crop plant which improves growth and immunity.
- ✓ To improve the fertility of the soil and crop productivity.

The Context

Vegetative parameters of the cultivated crops were good, observed healthy with minimal pests attack. Few planted crops started yielding, yield parameters to be onserved in the coming weeks.



The Practice

The beneficial microorganisms such as *Rhizobium sp.*, was isolated from the root nodules of legumes; *Azotobacter sp.*, and phoshosphobacteria were isolated from the soil respectively. They were mass produced, mixed in right proportions and injected into the carrier material (peat) to prepare biofertilizer consortium.

Crops tested

- 1. Tomato
- 2. Brinjal
- 3. Beans
- 4. Cucumber
- 5. Ridge Guard and
- 6. Corn

Evidence of Success

Since two years we are using the same field for our practice, the fertility of the field (soil) was observed better in growth and nutrients tested before and after the application of microbial consortium compared to last year. Seedling emerged from the soil soon and started growing well as usual in agricultural field. Few crops started yielding and the parameters to be observed. This shows the soil fertility, water percolation and aeration of the field for good productivity.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required

Sufficient water facility was not there, regular monitoring and watering were found to be difficult. Because it's far away from our college. So we suggest that if we get a small plot of land from our college it would be useful to access and monitor nearby.



Brief Write up of the Programme:

Centre for Social Activities of Kirstu Jayanti College is proud to organize the Rural Exposure Camp in Purushanahalli village, Doddaballapura Taluk, Bengaluru from 06/12/2018 to 09/12/2018. The objective of the camp is to enable students to understand the socioeconomic and cultural conditions of rural life and to help students integrate essential values for life. The Theme of the camp is UN-SDG-1 "No poverty". According to the United Nations, "Eradicating poverty in all its forms remains one of the greatest challenges facing humanity. Alumni conducted an interactive session for the volunteers. The volunteers were divided into groups and had a game session which tested the unity, knowledge, ideas,




awareness and social commitment of CSA Volunteers. This session was an eye opener to the CSA volunteers and it helped them to have introspection about their role as a CSA volunteer.









Objective of the Programme:


To create awareness on promoting healthy food habits, maintaining proper hygiene and emphasizing the importance of education among the public.
