## 2ND INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON TRANSDISCIPLINARY RESEARCH IN LIFE SCIENCES (ICTRLS): PLANETARY HEALTH

The Department of Life Sciences at Kristu (Autonomous), College Javanti University with the collaboration Sciences Trans-Disciplinary Health Technology (TDU), University of Michigan -Flint, USA, and Belmont University, USA, organised the 2nd International Conference on Transdisciplinary Research in Life Sciences (ICTRLS) on 6th and 7th March. This year's conference, themed "Planetary Health," was supported by the Karnataka State Council for Science and Technology (KSCST).

The event attracted 200+ participants from over 33 institutions across the country. The conference was inaugurated by Prof Chandrabhas Narayana, Director, Rajiv Gandhi Centre for Biotechnology, Thiruvananthapuram, who was honoured by Fr Jais V Thomas, Financial Administrator, Kristu Jayanti College (Autonomous). The inauguration set the stage for insightful discussions on ecological sustainability and interdisciplinary learning.

In his Presidential Address, Fr Jais V Thomas emphasised the shift from anthropocentrism to biocentrism, highlighting interdependence and the need to integrate technology with philosophy for ecological harmony. In his Inaugural Address, Prof Narayana advocated for learning beyond exams. He introduced concepts like "Bio-E3" and "BioClusters," stressing their incorporation into such conferences to foster meaningful learning.

The conference featured a series of technical sessions led by eminent scientists, including:
