Kristu Jayanti's tribute to Colonial Imprints: Bangalore's evolution through History



Bangalore's past through Historical Imprints: Colonial Photographs" a photo exhibition, was organized by The Indian Council of Historical Research (ICHR) in association with the Department of History, KJC, the exhibition focused on understanding the impact and imprint of Bangalore's development through the years. It was inaugurated by Fr. Dr. Augustine George, Principal, KIC alongside the chief guest Dr. S.K Aruni, Regional Director, ICHR, South Regional Centre, Bengaluru. The exhibition showcased digital prints that seamlessly showed the transition of the city from the pre-colonial era to the post colonial era. It consisted of historical visuals of colonial architecture, military presence, social life and the city's development under British rule. These visuals were mainly sourced from the archives of ICHR and the British library. Dr S.K Advani took it upon himself to educate those present in the audience about the retrieved artifacts and their significance in understanding the era of their existence. The exhibition was part of a two-series event which aimed to create awareness and help understand the impact of Bangalore's history. Speaking on the inauguration Fr.
