KIA authorities to construct roads with plastic waste

Plastic which is an integral part of human requirements, has become the greatest challenge and pollutant today. In a study by Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) stated that India generates 26,000 tonnes of plastic every day.

To impact this issue, Bengaluru International Airport which KK plastic Waste Management, the agency bought sustainable measures, as it began to use plastics as an additive while laying roads to the airport.

Bengaluru is the first city to carry out commercial experiment with building plastic roads. The unique initiative aims at raising awareness about waste segregation at source to create a cleaner, greener and more sustainable environment.

Plastic turns into road at Kempegowda

International Airport which KK Plastic Waste Management, the agency that has the technology to mix waste plastic with bitumen, will carry out the collection. Bangalore International Airport Limited (BIAL) on 26 September, 2019 launched its ambitious



'Plastic Beku' (want plastic) campaign with radio channel Big FM and FMCG giant, ITC's food division. BIAL aims to construct 50 km of road on its premises using plastic waste that is not degradable or reusable.

The airport authorities

have already taken measure and installed specially designed dustbins at Kempegowda International Airport (KIA) to dispose plastic garbage which will be used to build roads. While speaking to The Logical Indian, the man behind the initiative,

Ahmed Khan, Managing Director of KK Plastic Waste Management (KPWM) said, "The city of Bengaluru generates over 300 to 400 tonnes of plastic waste every month. Once the process starts, the city could be a model for other places in the country."

Tom Shimmin, Chief Project Officer, BIAL, said that the Plastic Beku campaign could bring a massive change to the world. "Eliminating the irresponsible use of plastic is one among BIAL's many sustainable initiatives. Building durable roads with plastic is an easier and ecologically efficient way to dispose of plastic waste," he said.

KK Plastic Waste Management, the agency that has the technology to mix waste plastic with bitumen, will carry out the collection. Explaining the process, BIAL officials said that this would be carried out in accordance with the guidelines of the Indian Road Congress. "The aggregate and bitumen will be heated and is transferred to the mixing chamber then, 6% to 8 % of the plastic will be blended with mix."

One doctor for 60 patients

The Primary Health Centre located in K. Narayanapuram is struggling to function effectively due to shortage of staffs. The health center where more than one lakh people rely on has just one doctor, five nurses and a helper. Established more than three decades ago, this health center does not provide any specialised treatment or test for its patients. The health center has only got in-patient and out-patient facilities. At a time only six patients can avail the in-patient facility from 9 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. The hospital authorities say that 60-70 patients use the facility every day. The Government health center plays a vital role in carrying out the Government's plan to eradicate malaria by 2020. One the major challenge for them is the lack of doctor. "We gave petition to the government to fill the vacancy and lack of facilities. There is

no response from the government and there is no enough medicine for the treatment. We visit the patients at least once in a month," said the hospital staff. There are about 32 National Programs initiated in order to prevent various diseases such as dengue, cancer, diabetes etc. The health center also provides free HIV test. "This prevents the virus from spreading, precautions can be taken for the virus" commented one of the staff. One of the major issue health center facing is the lack of staff and doctors. The hospital authorities said that they had informed the government regarding the issue. The staff members hope that relevant action will be taken, and the lack of staff will be solved by the government for the better serving of the public.

"Municipal negligence leading to illness", comments residents

The improper disposal of water has resulted in creating breeding grounds for mosquitoes, affecting people in K. Narayanapura. Due to the improper flow of rain water and garbage disposal many people are suffering with the dengue fever.

As dengue is seen in this rainy season in Bangalore it is hard for people to survive in such conditions. More than the 200 cases are

recorded in Bangalore in 2019 monsoon season studies

The local residents blame the lack of proper drainage system, to the major outbreak of diseases. When this case was enquired

Social Harmony Triumphs in Ayodhya Verdict

The heart of our constitution demands equality among its citizens and thus enforced it with law. According to our constitution every religious practice is given equal importance and respect. Every judge in the court is entitled to follow these values and uphold the constitutional demands. The Ayodhya verdict is an example of this social harmony, a sensitive case handled according to our constitutional values.

The history takes us back to 1992, where a mob of Hindus demolished the Babri Masjid stating that it was built in the birthplace of Lord Rama. The century long conflict regarding the ownership of the land escalated with this incident. Land dispute case was filed in the court, where the first verdict was given by the Allahabad High Court. The Allahabad High Court pronounces its verdict on four title suits relating to the Ayodhya dispute on 30 September 2010. Ayodhya land to be divided into three parts. One third goes to Ram Lalla represented by Hindu Maha Sabha, Sunni Wakf Board and Nirmohi Akhara.

The biggest political trigger of the contemporary times, the Babri Masjid demolition and Ramjanmabhoomi dispute has been sorted out unanimously by five judges from various backgrounds and stature. The apex court decided to solve this sensitive issue that to give the disputed 2.77 acres to build Ram Temple and asked the government to find five acres in a prominent place in Ayodhya for a masjid to be built up.

Both the verdict reflects the diplomatic stand taken by the judiciary in a religious dispute. The Allahabad High Court tried to end the clash by dividing the land among the three plaintiffs.

On the other hand, the Supreme Court went through the evidence and accomplished a genuine approach towards the case.

Even though demolition of the Babri Mosque stays as a case in the court, issue

regarding the ownership was cleared by the Supreme Court according to the evidence put forth by both the groups. The court gave the verdict not just by handing over the land, but only for construction of the temple which was a wise step taken by the judiciary.

Compared to the Allahabad High Court, the SC verdict makes sure that the land is only used for religious purpose and not for any other use in future.

The only demand put forth by the Sunni Waqaf Board is that, they require the land in Ayodhya itself as, the land has many graveyards and Dargaah including that of 18th century Sufi saint Qazi Qudwah. By asking the Central government to provide five-acre land in the city, the Supreme Court fulfilled the demand of both religious group on a rational ground.

The peaceful situation in the nation after the Supreme Court verdict regarding the case shows the unity and strength among the citizens in the nation even though having diverse culture and religion.

initiatives is aimed at accountability and citizen-centric approach of the Government. The Lok Sabha had passed the Right to Information (Amendment) Bill, 2019 on 22nd July, where bill changes the terms and conditions of service of the CIC and Information Commissioners at the centre and in states.

The main key differences in the RTI Amendment 2019 bill was Centre will notify the tenure of all information commissioners (ICs) at state and central level, salaries and allowances of these officers will be determined by the Central government. The officials who receive pension or other

retirement benefits, their salaries will be reduced by an amount equal to the pension- these provisions have been removed in the Amendment.

Technological boom is affecting the function of our brain



Government Institutes Lacks Employees

Shortage of employees is the major issue faced by the government institutes in K. Narayanapura, Bengaluru. The government school as well as the government health centre in this locality are having the similar problem because of shortage of staff. There are no enough faculties for the students in the government school. Approximately 130 students are studying in the school, in which a class has an average of 35 students. The school runs class I to V with just four teachers. This will affect the quality of the work for teachers and students. One of the faculty member mentioned that they had informed the government regarding this issue but follow up was not seen. They

expect that the problem will be solved within a year. The Health Centre near the school is another example. The primary health centre has got just one doctor. According to the staff more than one lakh people relay on this primary health centre. "Government is only interested in constructing institutes to please the residents of the area, but not concerned about its proper functioning. It is clearly visible that the government institutes have got poor recruitment process and this lack of concern takes away the quality of these organizations which forces citizens to rely on private institutes," commented a government employee, who wished to remain

unnamed. The major reason why people rely on private organization is due to the negligence shown by the government in the proper functioning of its own institutes. Government institutes are meant to be asset for the citizens and not to be a tool for the government to exhibit it as their achievement where half the requirement is not fulfilled.



Slums in Bangalore

The word "slum" is often used to describe vernacular settlements within cities that have inadequate housing and grim, miserable living conditions. Slums are overcrowded providing comparatively less space for living. These settlements lack the basic municipal requirements such as water, street light and even roads for emergency situations.
