GOVERNANCE AT YOUR FINGER TIPS

Dr Rathan Kelkar, CEO, Center for E- governance, Government of Karnataka, interacted with the students on the topic 'Governance at your finger tips' for the twenty third edition of 'Vicharmanthan' which was held on July 27, 2015. In his address to students Dr. Kelkar emphasized on the initiatives taken by Government of Karnataka to digitalize India through e- governance. He said, "Karnataka, especially, has been positive in embracing the e-governance and has initiated over 4000 services to bring in first hand connectivity between the citizens and the government." While admitting the challenge in implementing e-governance at the grass root level, he said, "it has become a major challenge and the government has taken major steps to cope with this by devising initiatives like Sakala, Bhoomi, Bangalore one, and Mobile one where public can access any government related information in Kannada language."

'RBI REFORMS AND CURRENT TRENDS IN BANKING'

Ms. Deepali Pant Joshi, Executive Director, Reserve Bank of India; was the keynote speaker for the twenty fourth edition of Vicharmanthan which was held on September 11, 2015. In her address on the topic 'RBI Reforms and Current Trends in Banking' she said, "Reserve Bank of India (RBI) strengthens the monetary policy framework through strengthening our diverse and rich banking structure by granting licenses to new entrants, branch expansions and regulating foreign banks" While elucidating on the systemic risks, she said, there is a domino effect in the banking sector as

the collapse of one bank lead to many. To overcome this RBI has embarked on initiatives like timely supervisory interventions and risk detections.

Ms. Joshi also highlighted the 'Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojna' and the importance of creating bank accounts for every citizen to counter money laundering. Further speaking on the indigenization of currency note printing she said, "RBI is deciding on new numbering system for visually impaired



citizens and few other security features".

The session ended with Ms. Joshi inspiring the students by saying "The biggest strength of our country is the youth. And youth is a majority in our country contrary to some countries where majority is formed by aged people."



INDIA NEEDS MORE INVESTMENT IN EDUCATION

Bharat Ratna Prof. CNR Rao was the visionary guest for the Silver Jubilee edition of Vicharmanthan which was held on October 8, 2015. While addressing on the topic 'Doing Science in India' he

stressed on the importance of education. Prof. Rao observed that India's investment in education is two percent of the total GDP which is very less in contrast with countries like China and South Korea which invest eight per cent of their GDP in education sector. He stressed on research on the frontiers of science, saying the "research done by little people in little labs is what changes the face of science." He warned that if India does not invest enough in science and education within the next few years, it will be left behind.

Taking the renowned musician, Bismillah Khan's life as an example, he illustrated the value of simplicity in the midst of greatness. He further urged the students to be selfless saying that selflessness leads to fearlessness, and those who are fearless are the ones who run this world.

Mr. N. S. Vishwanathan, Executive Director, Reserve Bank of India addressed the Jayantians on the 27th edition of 'Vicharmanthan' on the topic "Financial Sector Regulations" on March 19, 2016. 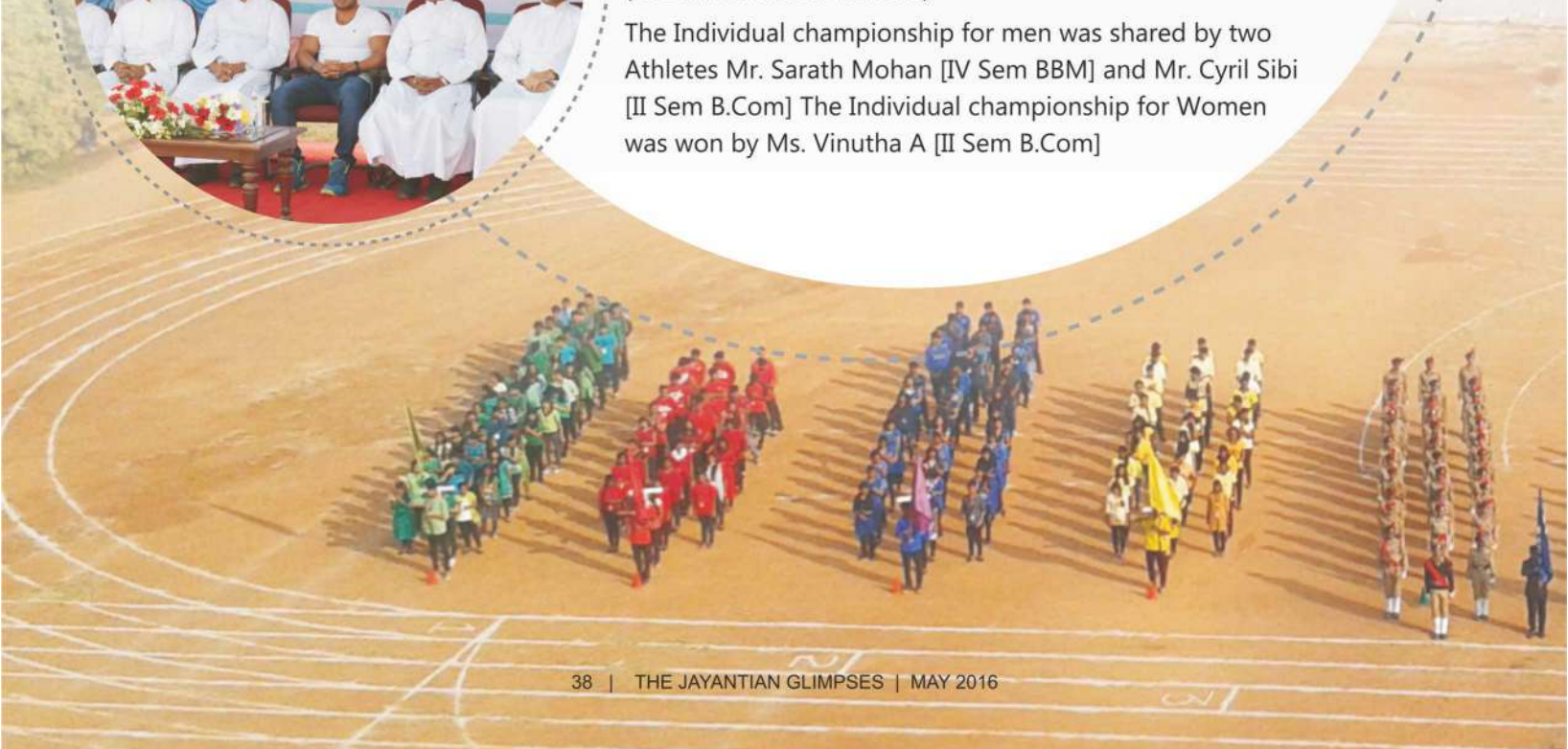

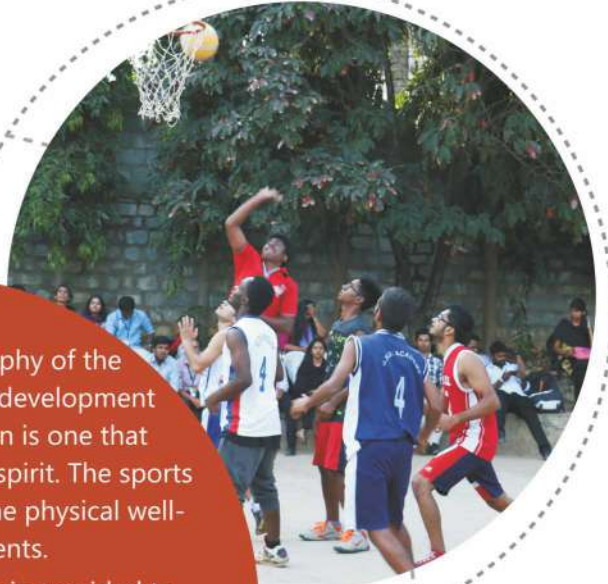
