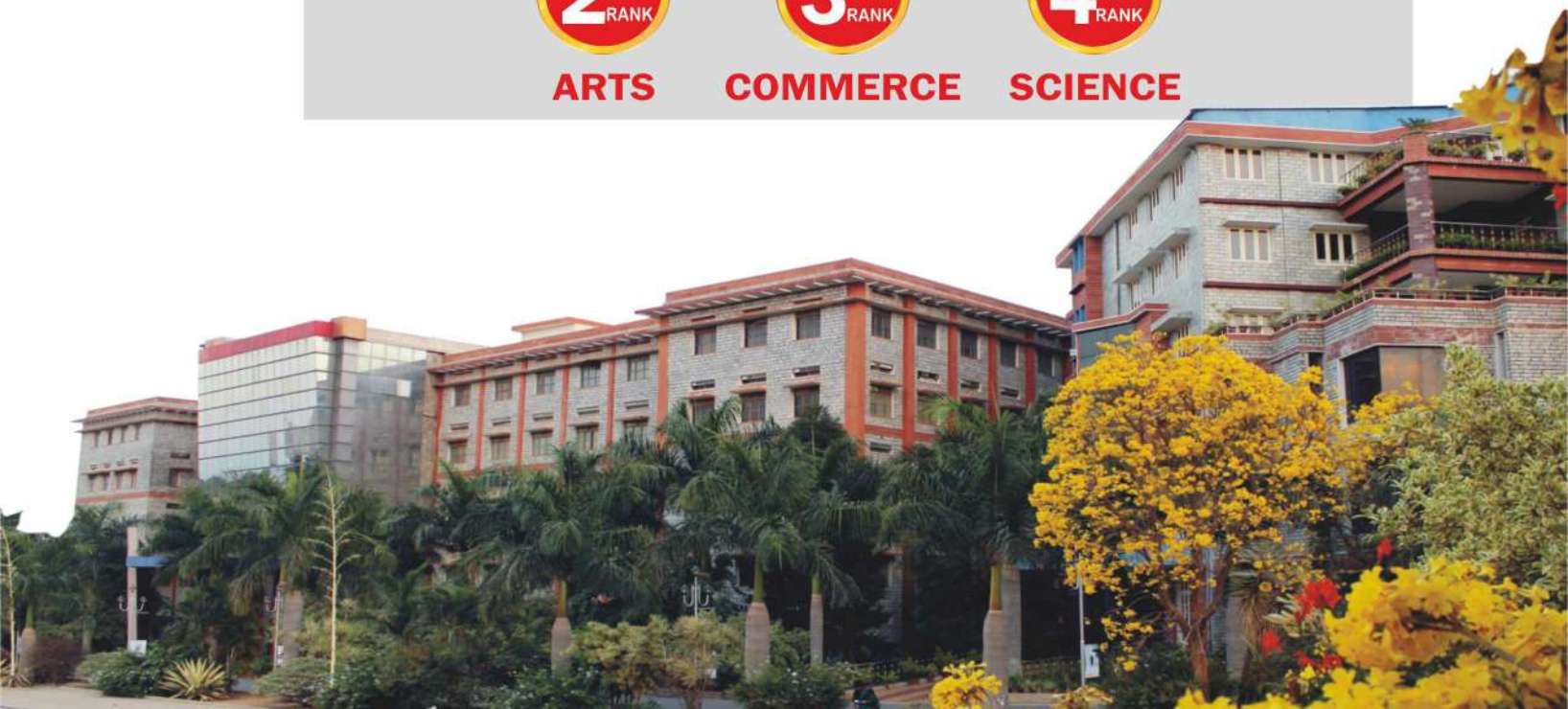

The event also marked the release of the computer science magazine 'Techno Bytes' by the Chief Guest. The department conducted the International conference in association with IEEE Bangalore section and the conference was technically partnered by IEEE.

## INCLUSIVE BUSINESS GROWTH & SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT



The Department of Commerce organized a two-day International Conference on 'Inclusive Business Growth and Sustainable Development' on February 22 and 23, 2017. The Chief Guest Dr. Deniz Parlak, Associate Professor at Dogus University, Istanbul, Turkey, inaugurated the conference. While addressing the gathering, she highlighted the dangers involved in India's borrowing especially US Dollars from foreign markets at high credit, which would in turn, cause peril to the speedy growth of the Indian and International

market.

The seminar witnessed five technical sessions: "Issues and Opportunities for CSR for Inclusive Business Growth and Sustainable Development" chaired by Shri. Sebi Chacko, Chief Human Resource Officer, Strides Shasun; "International Financial Dimensions of Growth & Sustainable Development" chaired by Dr. Alexander Lolievich, Professor & Dean, International Finance, Financial University under the Government of Russian Federation; "Innovation & Sustainability" by Mr. Srinu Bhopal, Co-Founder & CEO, Sherpify; "A View of Inclusive Financial Growth and Business Development" by CA Vikas Suresh Kumar and "The Development Business and Human Capital towards Sustainable Development of the Economy" by Shri Vijaya Anand. ## BUSINESS EXCELLENCE THROUGH TECHNOLOGICAL INTERVENTIONS



The School of Management, Kristu Jayanti College organized the 10<sup>th</sup> edition of 'KRISYM '17', the International Conference on 'Business Excellence through Technological Interventions' on April 28 & 29, 2017. The conference was jointly inaugurated by Ms. Yael Hashavit, Consul General, Consulate of Israel in Bengaluru and Shri Suresh Vaswani, Honorary Consul,

Consulate of Benin in Bengaluru. On the whole, the workshop enlightened everyone and helped them to practically implement the R-Programming commands.

He also stressed on the initiative called 'Roopanthara', undertaken by the government of Karnataka for the rehabilitation of prisoners, towards securing a better future for them.

Shri Prabhu emphasized on how the double electrification and the railway's plan to electrify 90 percent of it's railway lines would go hand in hand with the developmental strategies and environmental policies. He asserted that the government has taken eco-friendly measures for the electrification process using renewable energy resources. He also mentioned that going by the technological age, the railways has upgraded itself with the latest SMS facility intended to take care of the cleanliness and sanitation issues in railways. He educated the students about the renewed safety measures with the introduction of the Zero Accident Policy, a massive campaign which plans to reduce accidents, mainly derailment.

He also spoke about the dual achievement in the implementation of the E-catering facility which provided desired cuisines for the passengers regardless of regional differences and also provided financial stability to local Self Help Groups, enabling them to sell their products in a wider market.

This retail inflation would increase the price of goods and subdue the consumer purchase rate and pertaining to the situation, the requisite of area based incentives would be abolished.

## PANEL DISCUSSION ON THE SURROGACY BILL 2016

"When surrogacy is concerned, it is a women's choice to agree or disagree for it," said Ms. Gita Aravindam, an experienced journalist and author, during the panel discussion on 'Surrogacy Bill 2016', organized by the Department of Social Work, Kristu Jayanti College, on January 23, 2017. The panel discussion was moderated by Dr. Janet Parameshwar, Social Welfare Officer, Kidwai Memorial Institute of Oncology. The other panelists were Dr. A Thirumoorthy, Professor of Psychiatric Social Work, and clinical consultant, NIMHANS; Adv. Hari G Subramaniam, Founder and Chief Consultant, Indian Surrogacy Law Centre; and Dr. Rubina K Nadeem, Chief Medical Officer, Regal Hospital, Bangalore.

The discussion began with Dr. Rubina Nadeem giving a biological perspective to surrogacy. She said that the surrogate mother was musually screened for medical conditions, like diabetes, hypertension and HIV before the process begins. Dr. A Thirumoorthy spoke about the psychosocial aspects associated with surrogacy, and described it as an emotional turmoil for the parties involved. He also said that fear; anxiety and post-partum depression were some of the primary issues with surrogacy. He stressed on the importance of a positive and healthy child rearing. Dr. Thirumoorthy also touched upon the



social stigma associated with surrogacy in India. "If the bill is passed, there is a huge possibility that the whole industry might be moving underground," said Adv. Hari G Subramaniam, since there was an abundance of demand as well as supply. He said that the need for surrogate mothers was high as infertility was on the rise, and due to financial conditions, many women are offering surrogacy services. He said that instead of banning, it should be regulated. Ms. Gita Aravindam finally gave a bird's eye view of surrogacy in India. She defended commercial surrogacy by saying that being in need of money is not a sin.

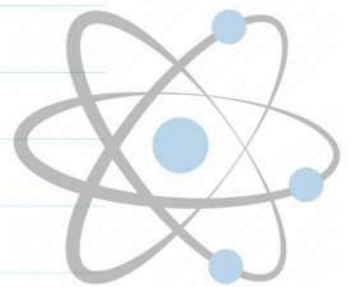
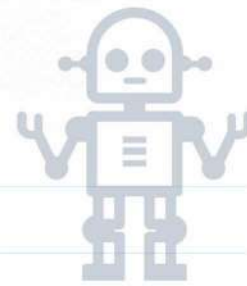

## BIOAURA

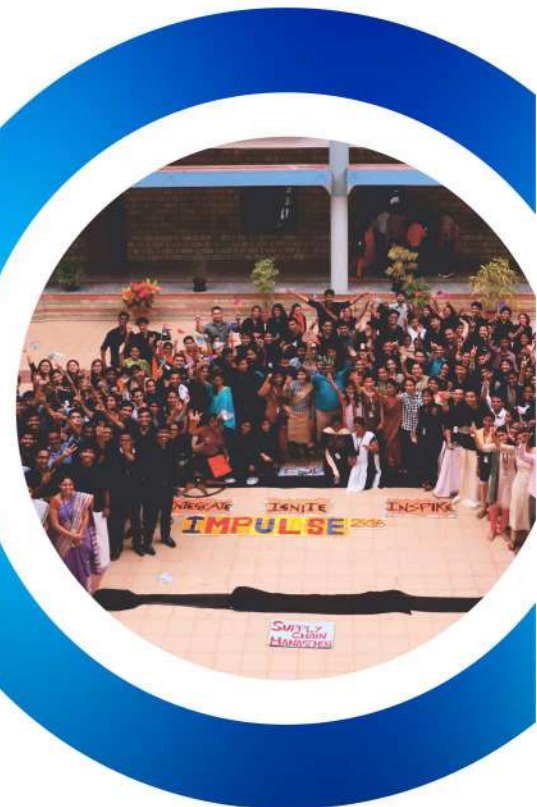

## SYNCHRONIZE

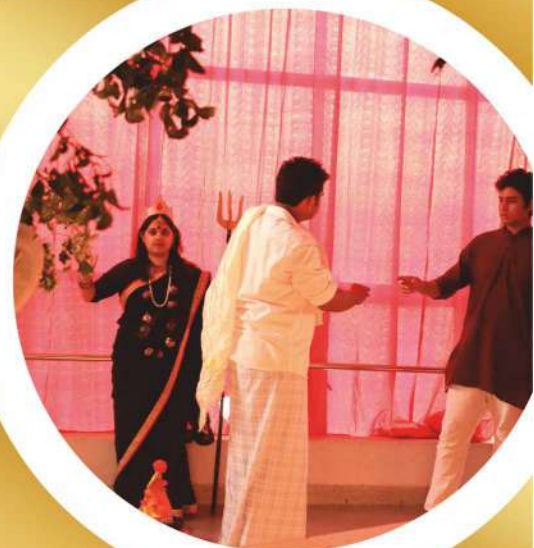

## SHRAMADAN

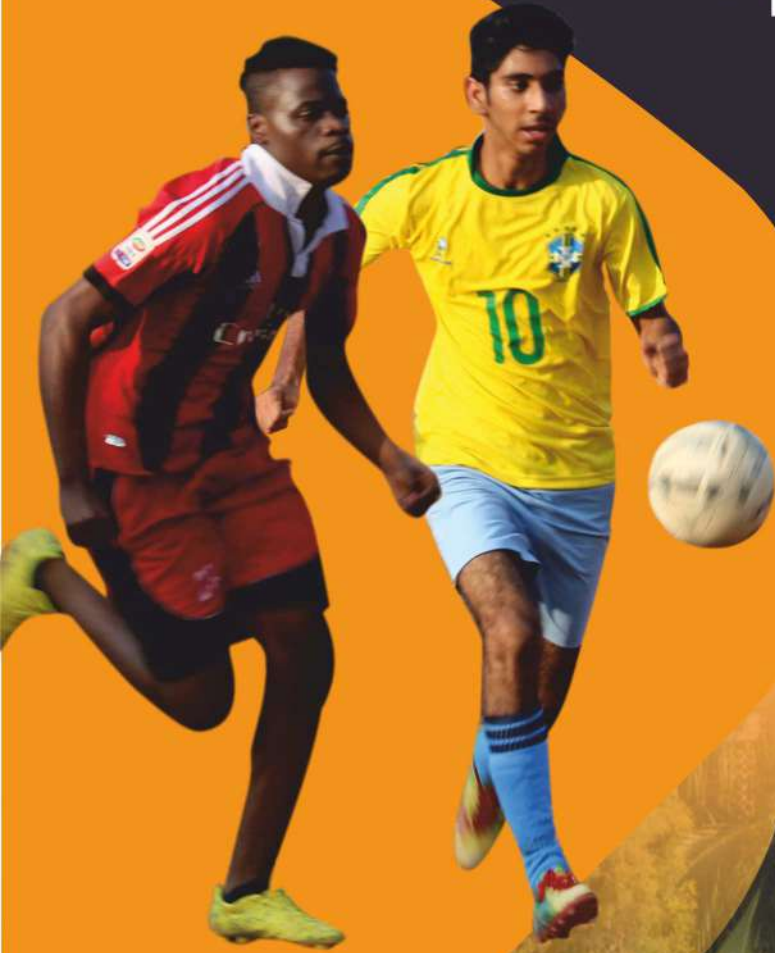

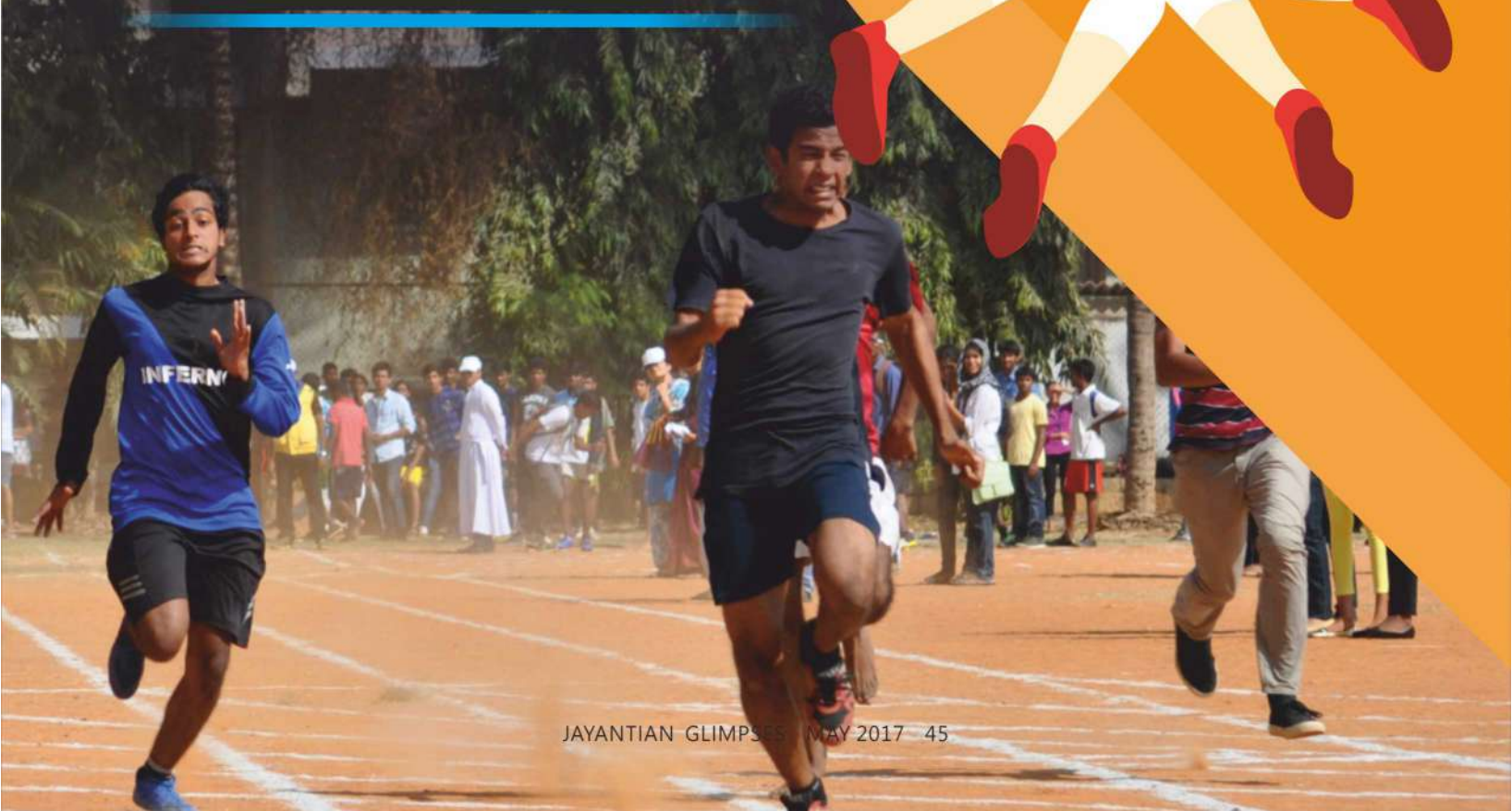

# ALUMNI MEET

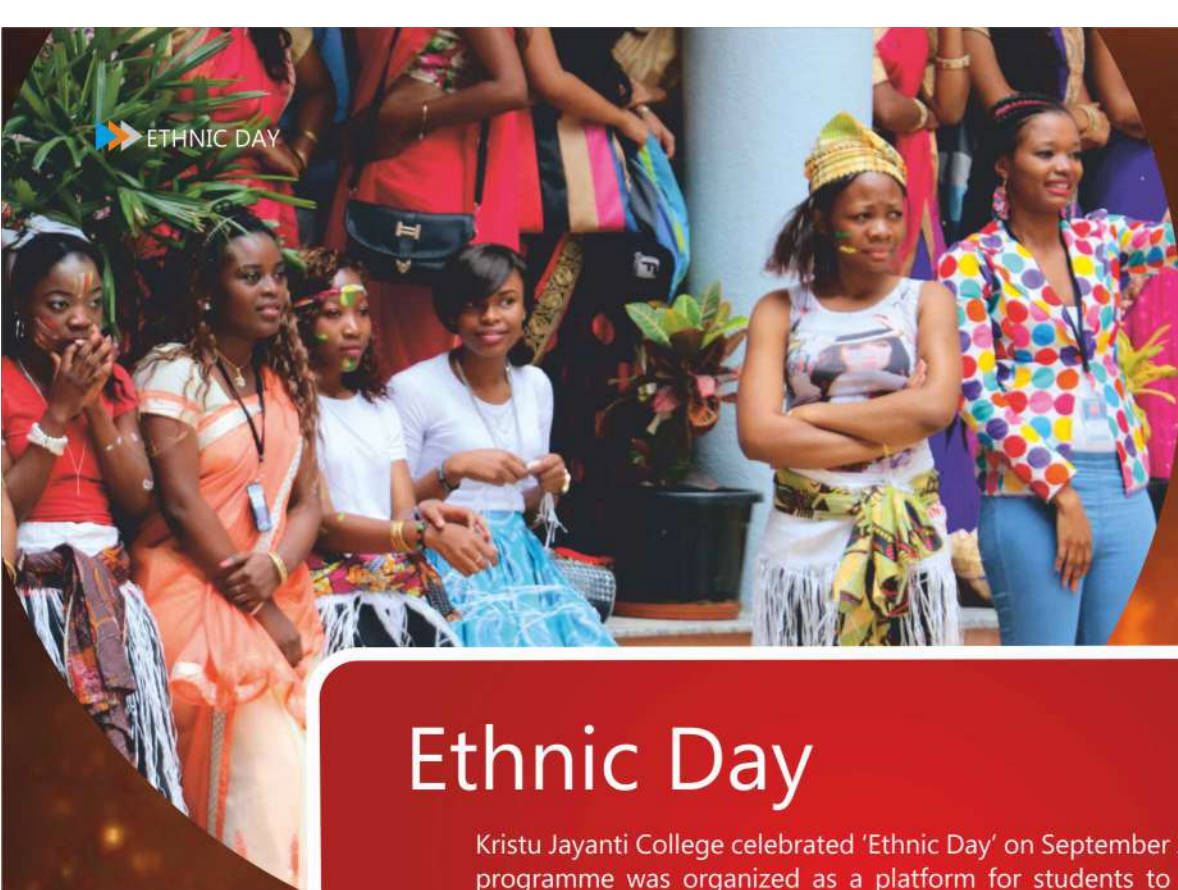


## MITROTSAVA

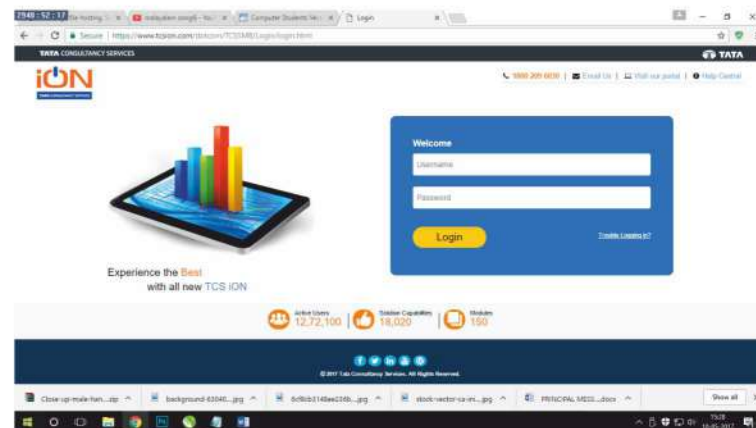
