Rama Subramaniam Gandhi, the Former Deputy Governor, Reserve Bank of India, addressed students on Demonetization. He threw light on the various objectives of Demonetization, which were to eliminate black money, fight against counterfeit notes and avoid financing of criminal activities. He also revealed two unannounced objectives behind the same -to encourage the public to use digital transaction methods to stop tax evasions and to make it deterrent for the future.

He also discussed the challenges faced by the Central Bank and the sensitivity they possess against black money and counterfeiting of notes. During the interaction, he commented on how it is impossible to have a cashless economy and eradicate currency notes completely. He stated, "Individuals generally prefer to use the liquid money for matters they don't want to reveal and conceal for personal privacy. A country cannot dictate its citizens although promotional efforts for ideas such as cashless economy can be carried out for the nation's development".

GLOBALIZATION OF THE INDIAN ECONOMY

Dr. Michael Debabrata Patra

“There is great potential for India to expand in this area if we wish to join the high table of global economic powers.”

Dr. Michael Debabrata Patra, Executive Director, Reserve Bank of India and Member of the Monetary Policy Committee of India gave a promising look into the future of the Indian economy, during the thirty-fifth edition of Vichaarmanthan, hosted by Kristu Jayanti College on September 15, 2017. Dr Patra shared, “India contributes to about one-seventh of the world’s growth, thus it is estimated that by the year 2030, India will overtake China as the world’s largest economy”. He further highlighted the lingering effects of the Global Financial Crisis of 2008.

Dr Michael Debabrata Patra explained the importance of agriculture to the Indian economy. He opined, “India leads the world in several fields of agricultural exports. Yet we have to increase the rate of production per acre. There is great potential for India to expand in this area if we wish to join the high table of global economic powers”. Dr Patra also spoke about the issue of inflation and its effect on society.

CONCEPT OF GOOD CINEMA

Padma Vibhushan Adoor Gopalakrishnan

“It is important that we expose the concept of a good cinema to children from a young age”

Padma Vibhushan Adoor Gopalakrishnan, a renowned filmmaker, during the thirty sixth edition of Vichaarmanthan, held on March 15, 2018, threw light on what cinema meant, and the changes brought about in the present day scenario. He said, “The idea of spreading the message of good cinema is getting lost by the minute. It is important that we expose the concept of a good cinema to children from a young age”. He gave a broad outline of the Indian film history and traced its roots back all the way to Nehru’s period. He told the students that the initiation of an International Film Festival is what brought about remarkable standards in the Indian film industry. He urged on the concept of a good cinema, the ones that used to touch the audience and not merely forgotten. He also went on to talk about censorship and the hampering of creativity of film makers by explaining how the flow of the movie is interrupted when shots get cut.

The session helped in shifting the view point of students from the mainstream media and taking them back to the golden era during which film making was considered as a pure art form.

Ratnakara Aithal, Former Professor of Law, Karnataka University, Dharwad, was the resource person. He addressed the facts related to Law & Justice and pointed out that most important objective of Law - to provide justice and fair treatment. The speaker highlighted the relation between law and justice and how it can be perceived in three ways in relation to each other.





Student Activism: Role of Law Students in Democratic Process

Kristu Jayanti College of Law organized a session on 'Student Activism: Role of Law Students in Democratic Process'. The speaker, Dr. Satish Gowda, Assistant Professor, University College of Law, Bengaluru, started off by encouraging the students to involve themselves in some way or the other towards contributing to the society. He emphasized on the fact that to have quality knowledge there should be quality information and such quality information is the basic necessity and a process that is achievable through quality information. He also stated that the law students should be a source of quality information and the students could only perfect this if they involve themselves in the society.

Federal Principles Under the Indian Constitution

Kristu Jayanti College of Law organized an interactive session on 'Federal Principles under the Indian Constitution' on April 21, 2018. The speaker, Prof. Dr. K.B. Kempe Gowda, Principal, Vivekananda College of Law, Bengaluru, addressed the importance of the Constitution and how it became a reason for the framing of the Governing System of the Country. He also spoke of the distinct features of the Constitution and went on to introduce the concepts federalism, confederation, federation and how these concepts are correlative to some extent. The session concluded with the illustration of several case laws with relation to Indian Constitution.



Environmental Law and Development

An Interactive session was organized by the Kristu Jayanti College of Law on April 6, 2018, addressing the topic, 'Environmental Law and Development'. Dr. M.K. Ramesh, Professor of Law, National Law School of India University, Bengaluru, the speaker, stated the importance of environmental balance. He emphasized on the delicate correlation between human beings and the environment and also how any change in the environment can affect both the human beings and the environment. The speaker also touched upon the concept of sustainable development. The speaker went on to talk on the role of the Supreme Court in protecting the environment that would pave way for new horizons in this field.



Right to Health Patenting and Generic Medicine in India

Kristu Jayanti College of Law organised a session on 'Right to Health Patenting and Generic Medicine in India' on April 27, 2018. Justice V Gopala Gowda was the chief guest and the keynote speaker for the occasion. Justice Gowda stated, "The right to health has been interpreted in Paramanad Katara as implicit under Article 21 - Protection of Life and Personal Liberty- as a fundamental right by the Apex Court. The government should enforce the right to health and create access to generic medicine in every panchayath through primary health centres". He pointed out that programmes should be organised to create awareness about patenting procedure among the common man. Justice Gopala Gowda stressed that government and medical council of India should maintain a strict regulation regarding the prescription of generic medicines.

Moot Court



Kristu Jayanti College of Law organized a talk on 'Moot Court' on March 17, 2018 for the Law students. Ms. Maria Madanikka Victor, Advocate, V.M. 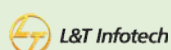

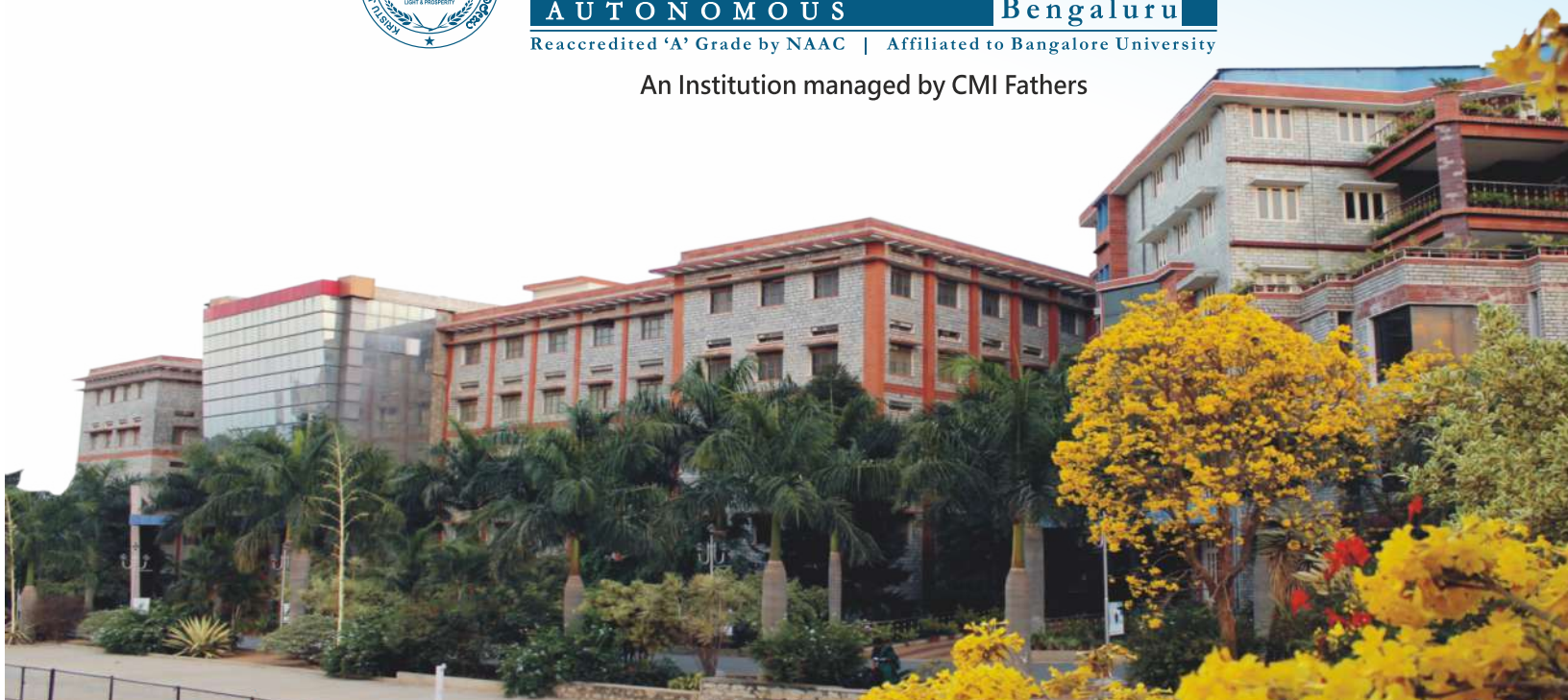
