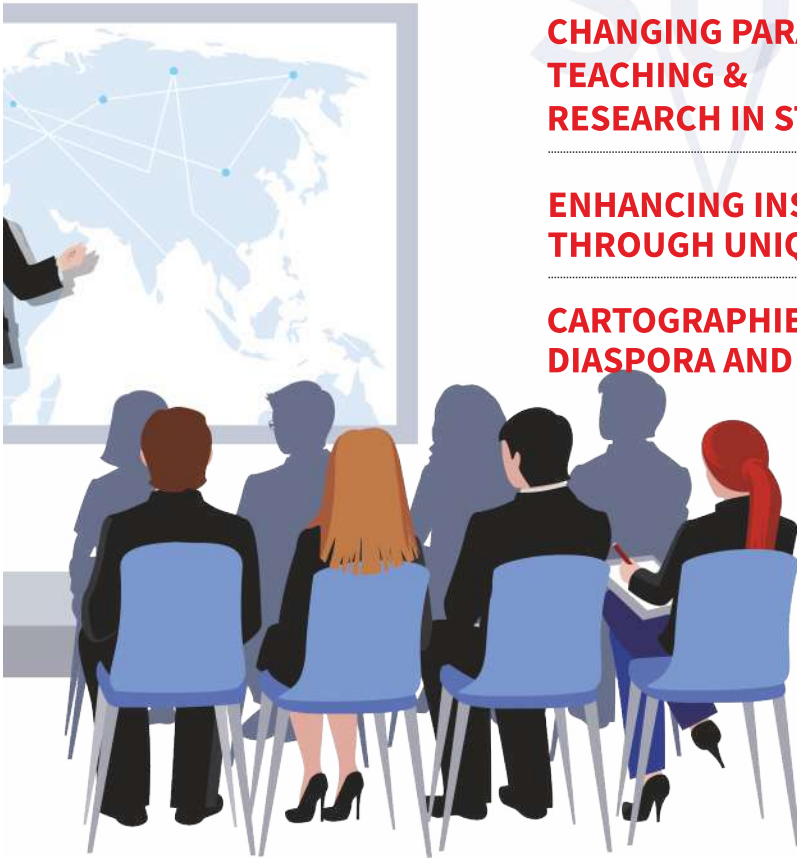

She attributed her success in life and career to 4E's of Success that are Energy, Energizer, Edge and Execution.



## CULTURAL DIVERSITY IN THE ORGANIZATION

**A**n interactive session was organized by the School of Management on November 7, 2018. Mr Stephen Coman, Director, Human Capital Management, Grant Thornton was the Key Speaker. Mr Coman enumerated the expectations of an interviewer for a job. He explained and discussed the star model and how to frame them in a situation focusing on action and result. Mr Coman shared his insights and tips on how to be more effective in the



workplace. He explained to the students about the cultural diversity in the organization. Mr Coman advocated that every person in an organization or an institution is unique and that unnecessary comparison needs to be avoided. Mr Coman, explained the Johari window and highlighted that self-discovery and knowing oneself is very essential to have a successful corporate career. He stressed that the students should identify their strengths and the purpose in their lives.

## CONTEMPORARY AND ANCIENT TISSUES GIVE MODERN INSIGHTS INTO BIOMEDICAL ENGINEERING

The Department of Life Sciences organised an International Lecture Series on the topic 'Contemporary and Ancient tissues give Modern Insights into Biomedical Engineering' on October 4, 2018. Dr Joseph Orgel, Professor of Biology and Biomedical Engineering, Illinois Institute of Technology, Chicago and Dr Elizabeth S. Friedman, Professor of Anthropology, Lewis College of Human Sciences, Illinois Institute of Technology, Chicago were the guest speakers.

Prof. Dr Joseph Orgel gave an insight into the collagen and extracellular matrix (ECM) structure. He explained the collagen structure and its Triple- helical conformation. He also showed some pieces of evidence of how collagen of different organ and tissues from different animals had different X-ray diffraction. Dr Elizabeth S. Friedman shared the information about the history and architecture of the Illinois Institute of Technology (IIT), Chicago and the list of programs available at IIT.





## CAREER EXCELLENCE IN INTERNATIONAL ENVIRONMENT

The Department of Management Kristu Jayanti College organised an International lecture series on “Career Excellence in International Environment” on November 28, 2018. Prof. Ruth Wallace, Dean, College of Indigenous Futures and Art Society and Prof. Ganesh Koramannil, Research Scholar College of Indigenous Futures and Art Society, Charles Darwin University, Australia were the resource persons.

Prof. Ruth mentioned about qualities such as innovation, problem-solving ability, creativity which are important in a potential employee, besides the grades for the dynamic environment. Prof. Ganesh Koramannil enlightened the gathering about Australian culture and the similarities between the Indian and Australian culture. He also shared his experience being an Indian in Australia and how Australia enabled him to realize his potential. The lecture provided relevant information on higher education at Australian universities to prospective students.



## WHY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND NOT JUST GROWTH



The Department of Economics Kristu Jayanti College organized an International Expert Lecture on “Why Economic Development and Not Just Growth” on April 9,

2019. The resource person was Mr Jahir Islam, Faculty School of Economics, Finance and Management, University of Bristol, United Kingdom. Mr Islam began his talk with an extract from Human Development Report and then explained how growth is dissimilar from development. He then demystified the various internal and external barriers that blocked growth to translate into development. He told students to aim for sustainable human development and not just sustainable or human development.

## GLOBAL REPORTING

The Department of Journalism and Mass Communication organised an international lecture series on January 16, 2019. Prof. Chike Frankie Edozien, Journalist, Author and a faculty member of New York University addressed the students about global reporting. He explained how developing nations of Asia and Africa are covered in global media. He said that in the age of technology, the idea of what is local has changed. He defined how the traditional western media look at developing nations and listed five criteria with regard to developing countries that make the news - Death, Diseases, Disaster, Despair, and Corruption. Prof. Edozien explained that this one-sided portrayal and whitewashing news lead to widespread misrepresentation and misconceptions about the countries.

He elucidated on the need to change this and put the prerogative on the budding journalists to change this perception. This, he believes, can be done by laying down the importance of story-telling and changing the narrative of the developing nations.



## STEPPING STONES FOR QUALITY RESEARCH

The Department of Computer Science (PG) conducted the International Lecture Series on July 30, 2018, titled “Stepping Stones for Quality Research”. Dr. Seyed Mohamed Buhari, Faculty of Computing & IT, King Abdulaziz University, Saudi Arabia was the resource person. The session was of immense use to those who wished to enhance the knowledge on how to identify the area for research and narrow down to the topic. The objective of the

lecture was to provide knowledge about the structure and process of research, and the way in which information was analysed, which helped the participants to identify the problem to conduct quality research based on areas of interest. It also helped in enhancing the knowledge base of using “Zotero” software to import related papers and add citation and bibliography easily to our research paper.

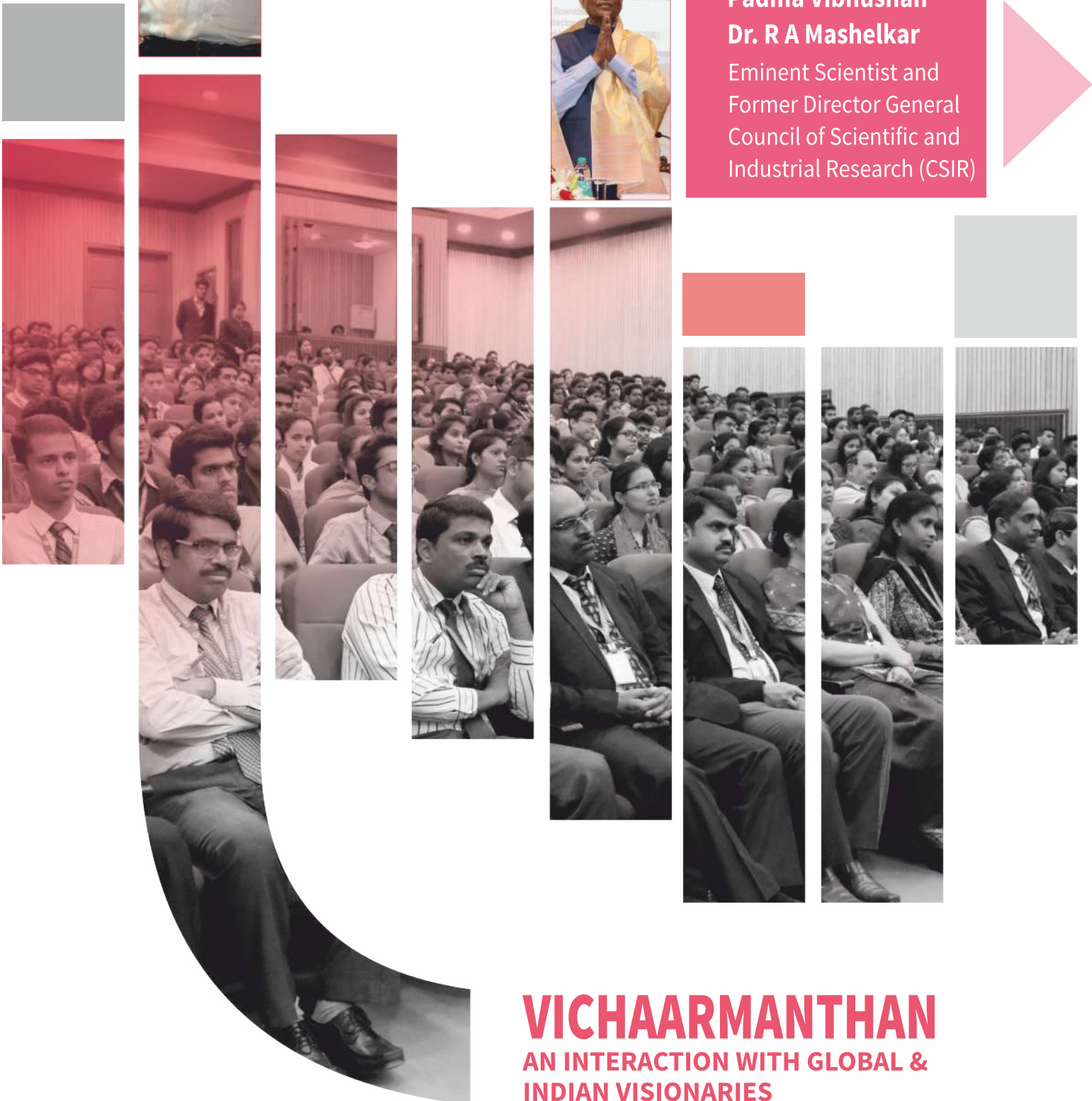

Shri. Rajeev Chawla, IAS

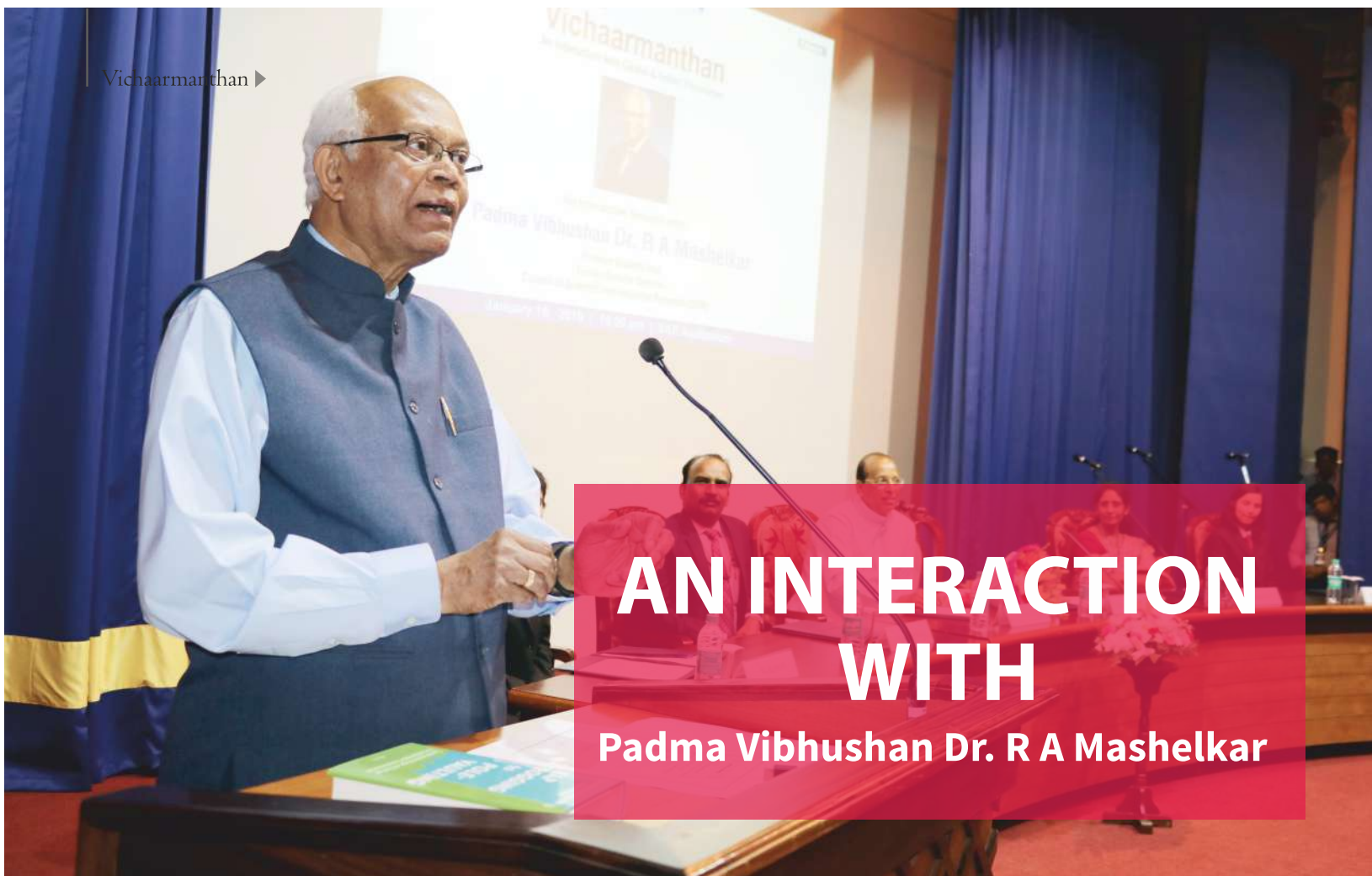

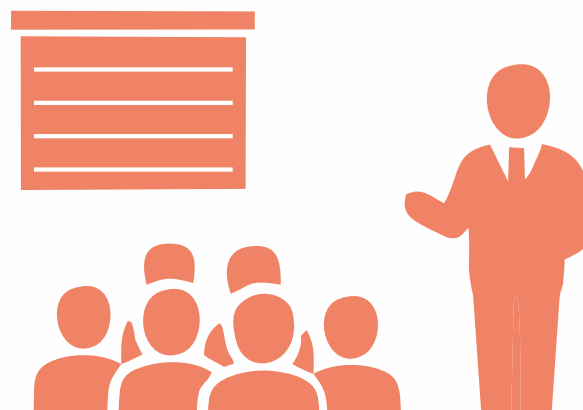


## DYNAMICS OF FOREX AND COMMODITY MARKETS

Mr Vivek stated the relationship between demand- supply and determination of the asset class. "The economy of any country is dependent on the oil market, forex market and gold market. Gold is a highly important asset class in the country because it serves as a security which is financially termed as the best hedge against inflation. Demand for gold is globally very important," said Mr Vivek.

When inflation takes place, even the borrowings costs also increase and the economic value decreases. Forex, oil and gold markets are interlinked. Proper checking and thorough analysis of rapidly changing conditions must be tackled.

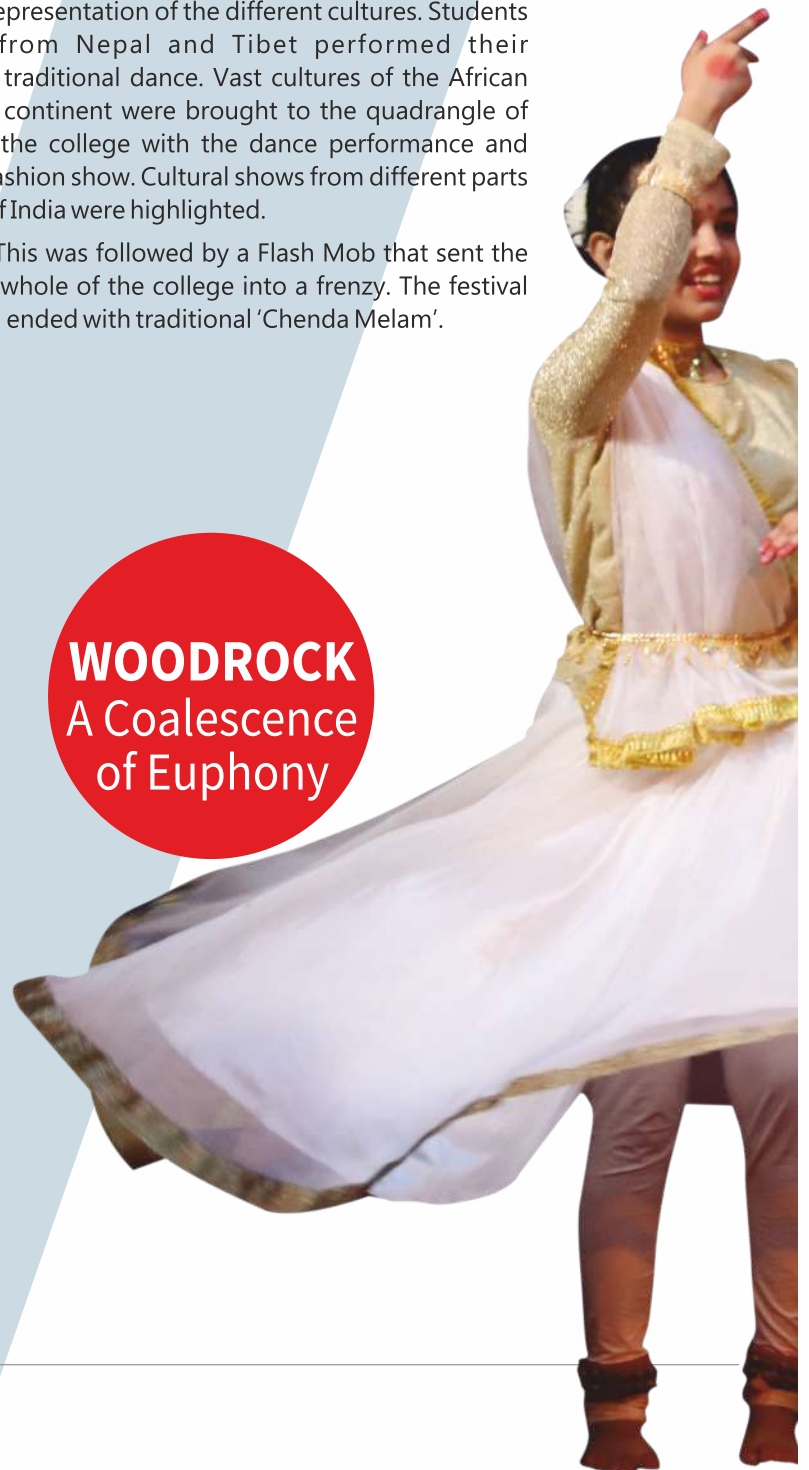

# INTER COLLEGIATE FESTS

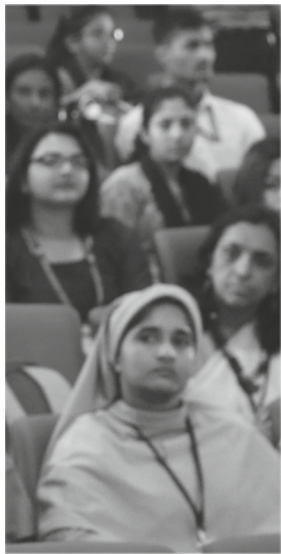

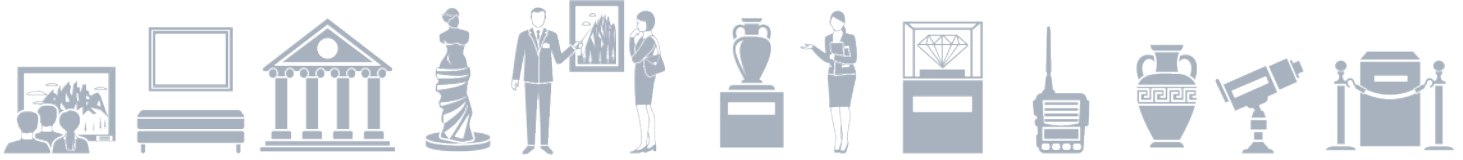


### SYNCHRONIZE

## TRAINING ON TRANSACTIONAL ANALYSIS

The Department of Social Work organized a Training programme on Transactional Analysis on January 31, 2019. The informative training sessions threw light on the meaning of transactional analysis and its various applications in the field. A lot of activities were conducted wherein the participants could come to a better understanding of ego states, and interpersonal relations. The programme triggered a sense of appreciation for the area of transactional analysis and its developments.

## FOREX FOR YOU

The Department of Economics, in relation to the Reserve Bank of India, organized a workshop on foreign exchange reserves on August 4, 2018. A team of ten officials from the Foreign Exchange Department, RBI, inculcated knowledge and insight regarding the topic. Shri P. J Thomas, Regional Director of RBI, Bangalore, graced the occasion as the Chief Guest while Shri R Sudeep, General Manager, Foreign Exchange department, RBI, Bangalore, was the guest of honour. Sessions covered significant aspects of our economy and its operations including the functions of the RBI, Forex facilities, foreign investment and foreign trade. Economics students benefitted immensely from a clear understanding of forex and its role in the Indian economy.

## IEEE WORKSHOP

The Department of Computer Science (UG), in association with IEEE organised a two-day workshop on 'Design, Development and Deployment of Machine Vision Intelligence in IoT Edge' on November 14 and 15, 2018. The technical session was handled by Dr Jayakumar Singaram, RINANU Semiconductor LLP, Bengaluru and Dr Jayakumar Venkatesan, Chief Executive Officer, Valles Marineris International Private Limited. They introduced crucial areas in the field, enabling participants to create a model in Watson Studio in the IBM Cloud, install Tensor Flow software in Ubuntu 64 bit machines. Discussions were centred around the potential of embedding intelligence in the IoT edge, IEEE BLP and its contribution to the world of IoT in education sector, ADAS, home automation, primary health centre, and taxi service. The event focused attention on research possibilities and innovations in the area.

## MENTAL HEALTH VOLUNTEERING

The final year M.Sc. Psychology students (Counselling and Industrial Specialization) had a two-day outbound training workshop on "Youth Volunteering for Mental Health" organized by National Institute of Mental Health and Neuroscience (NIMHANS), Bengaluru, supported by Rajiv Gandhi National institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD), Sriperumbudur. The program was held on July 19 and 20, 2018. The main objective was for the learners to recognize the need for mental health awareness, youth volunteering for awareness-raising, and carrying out Action projects. Over two days, different sessions were organized by a team of resource-persons whose messages were thought-provoking. The workshop successfully galvanized each participant to go ahead with the action project with zeal.

## ATTITUDINAL WORKSHOP

The Kristu Jayanti School of Management organized a four-day workshop in collaboration with Zeal Institute, Bengaluru, on shaping the attitude of MBA students, from August 6 - 9, 2018. The resource person, Prof. Anthony Williams, Founder and Director of Zeal Institute, placed leadership as the main leitmotif and epicentre of his programme. Over the span of the workshop, he dealt with the everyday problems of students and habits that may prove to be an inhibition in creating a success story. With personal life incidents and testimonies of previous clients, he strove to remind the students that destiny is not just "time + matter + chance" but also of hard work. The workshop provided opportunities for students to produce speeches, a worksheet to reflect upon themselves, and a series of thought-provoking talks. Packed with activities, the workshop proved to be a catalyst in awakening the students to their true potential and helping them prioritize their goals in order to make the best out of their lives.

## BUSINESS ETIQUETTE

An interactive session on 'Business Etiquette' was conducted by Prof. Sen B Mathews, Director, Centre for Employability and Corporate Relations, on August 4, 2018. The session focused on introducing business etiquettes to the MBA students. He began by highlighting the 'Evolution of an employee' and the impact of technology on working conditions across different ages. Students deliberated over eleven key points of proper business etiquette in the corporate world. There was emphasis on six vital facets, namely, KINESICS (gesture & posture), SPACE (proxemics), HAPTICS (touch & handshake), OCULESICS (eye & movements), OBJECT COMMUNICATION (grooming) and COLOUR (ambience & pace).

Mr Mathews also imparted the importance of the four P's in interpersonal and official relationships - Plan, Prepare, Practice, and Present, and how vital they are in a person's interpersonal skills. He concluded that the proliferation of technology has drastically changed the work culture, making it essential for professionals to conduct themselves with proper business etiquette and manners.

## APPLIED ECONOMETRICS

The Department of Economics, Kristu Jayanti College, organized a national level workshop on 'Applied Econometrics' on September 28 and 29, 2018. The programme consisted of various sessions that offered academic and practical knowledge on the topic. The workshop was inaugurated by Dr T. Rajendra Prasad Professor and Chairman, Department of Economics at Bangalore University. He emphasized on the critical importance of statistics and econometrics in research and economics as a whole. ## APPLIED BEHAVIOURAL ANALYSIS

The Department of Psychology organized a workshop on "Applied Behavioural Analysis" on July 19 and 20, 2018. The workshop was organized to acquaint students to the nuances of behaviour therapy. The students were trained by Ms Kinnari Bhatt, Board Certified Analyst and Director, DAKSH ABA & Autism Services. Students became well-versed in the history and basics of ABA and on topics such as Reinforcement. At the end of the event, students had a clear understanding of how an ABA-based intervention could be administered on clients.

The chief guest for the inaugural session was Dr Madhan Kumar Srinivasan, Associate Vice President, Accenture Solutions Ltd. He shared valuable thoughts that were very inspiring for the participants. This provided a platform for the participants to engage in knowledge transfer, discussion and networking. It includes hands-on session to develop Blockchain solutions. Blockchain development using Ethereum workshop apprised about the Ethereum Ecosystem and its differences from its rich cousin Bitcoin. It enabled to explore the Solidity programming language and smart contract optimizations.

## DATA JOURNALISM

The Department of Journalism and Mass Communication, organized a niche workshop on 'Data Journalism' on July 17, 2018. Shri Harikrishnan B, Assistant Professor, Department of Journalism and Creative writing, Central University of Himachal Pradesh, was the resource person. The workshop was divided into two sessions with the first session on surfacing through basic knowledge about the specialized subject through interactions and visual learning methods; this was followed by deeper insight of the subject in the later session. "Journalists are professional storytellers using visually," said Shri Harikrishnan B in context of emphasizing the importance of data journalism. The workshop not only strived to provide the students with a basic understanding of the subject but also focused on practical exposure and the awareness of the skill set needed to excel in the field.

## ADVANCED REPORT WRITING

The Department of Journalism, Kristu Jayanti College organised a workshop on "Advanced Report writing" for the PG students on January 10, 2019. Mr Pradeep Nair, News Editor, The Hindu, was the resource person. He explained different types of news, style of writing, maintenance of credibility in writing to the students in detail in his session.

He shared tips to find news stories and the importance of maintaining credibility by giving attribution to the sources in the stories. He also noted that correct attributions are a means to counter fake news. He introduced a new variety in journalism "Data journalism" as a career option for students. He also encouraged young aspirants to make use of western publications for reading which helps them in bringing innovative style into their writing.

## PARIKALPANA- A MINT OF CREATIVITY

The Department of Computer Science (UG), organized a workshop on interactive web design entitled "Parikalpana - A mint of creativity" on July 21, 2018. The event was inaugurated by Dr. Calistus Jude, Dean of Sciences along with Prof. Sevuga Pandian, Staff Coordinator and Dr. Ranjitha M, Faculty in-charge, ACM-W Student Chapter. Ms. Preethi S initiated the session with the basic features of HTML, forms and its attributes with examples. ## EARLY INDIAN SCRIPTS - ASHOKAN BRAHMI

A workshop on 'Early Indian Scripts- Ashokan Brahmi' was organized on September 28, 2018, to make students aware of the significance of ancient Indian scripts such as Ashokan Brahmi and to help them comprehend its significance in reconstructing historical narratives. Mr. Gautam Jantakal, Numismatics Consultant, Centre for Numismatic Studies, Bangalore, the resource person, initiated the students with a theorising session on the basics of Language and Scripts. In the second session, they were taught to identify the basic and elementary Ashokan Brahmi alphabets. They were also made to identify and transliterate simple words written in the Brahmi script. He concluded by discussing the evolution of the Ashokan Brahmi Script.

## PROPRIUM SERIES - SOLUTION FOCUSED BRIEF THERAPY

The department of Psychology organized a workshop on 'Solution Focused Brief Therapy' on September 22, 2018. Mr Maxim Pereira, Assistant Professor & Counsellor, Montfort College, Bengaluru, conducted the workshop with the objective of introducing students to the therapeutic and counselling process, and to introduce knowledge and skills of SFBT. The session traced the development of Solution-Focused Brief Therapy which is a post-modern approach. The focus of the therapy on solutions rather on problem solution was explained. 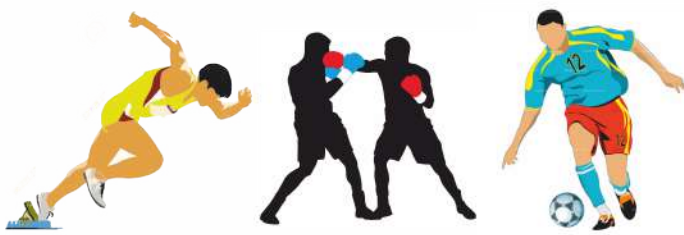

# NYAYA SAMVADA

## MARITIME LAW AND INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS

The 23rd Edition of Nyaya samvada, held on February 16, 2019, was an interactive session with Prof. (Capt.) A. Nagaraj Subbarao, Dean, Centre for Executive Education & Professor SCMS, Dayananda Sagar University, Bengaluru. Prof. Nagaraj explained the importance of management as a device preventing disasters from happening. Having led the marine life as Captain and being a part of several massive projects, he shared his experiences with different types of cargos and their importance in the Indian trade. The students were enlightened with Indian and International Maritime Laws, with special reference to the United Nations and the codes prescribed for member nations, especially the ISPS and the ISM codes which primarily deal with the safety and security of marine vessels and their employees.



## EXPANDING CONTOURS OF LEGAL PROFESSION AND HEALTH CARE LAW

An interactive session was organized by Kristu Jayanti College of Law on September 26, 2018. Dr. S.V. Joga Rao, visiting professor, National Law School of India, Bangalore spoke on the topic 'Expanding contours of Legal Profession and Health Care Law'. Speaking to law students and faculties, he highlighted the status of medical related laws or legislation in India. Being a medico-legal expert, he discussed many cases handled by him, mentioning a few paralysis cases that happened due to medical negligence. He explained at length about the conduction of the case, difficulty in producing the evidence, and proving the case etc. He also mentioned how advances in the scientific and medical fields affect the legal field. The session ended with the queries asked by the students and the interactions with the guest.

## INDIAN CONSTITUTION AND LABOUR

A session was organized on September 1, 2018, to impart knowledge on the Indian Constitution and Labour. The session was helmed by Prof. K.S. Sharma, Former Principal, J.S.S. Sakri Law College, Hubli. He explained that 'political party' is nowhere mentioned in the Constitution of India and therefore remains officially undefined till date. He also discussed about the justice rendered today and its types, these being social, economic and political, which too remain undefined by the Indian Constitution till date and thus are several criticized. These were discussed with reference to the Atrocities Act, 1989 which restricts an act of immediate arrest. Students were able to grasp the significance of the law with deep understanding.



## KRITRIMA NYAYA VEDIKA CONSUMER PROTECTION LAW

Kristu Jayanti College of Law organized Nyaya Samvada, an interactive session with the legal experts on February 11, 2019 with Dr. Ashok R. Patil, Professor of Law and Chair Professor Consumer Law and Protection, National Law School of India University, Bengaluru, as the chief guest. Invoking the Gandhian dictum of treating customers as the most important visitors to any business/enterprise, Dr Patil stressed the need for change of attitude of the entrepreneurs and business entities besides the conscious claim of the consumers for the better consumer protection. Dr. Patil highlighted the significance of the relationship between Consumer Law and the Law of Tort. He went on to explain the historical background of Consumer Protection Law as an offshoot of the Law of Tort, and gave salient features of other enactments of consumer protection such as Drugs And Cosmetics Act, Food Adulteration Act etc. Students were able to acquire clarity about the concepts that were described.



## POLICE (INTELLIGENCE) AND CRIMINAL LITIGATION

In an interactive session organized on November 17, 2018, by the Kristu Jayanti College of Law, Shri. Babu Anjanappa, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Intelligence, enlightened the students on Police (Intelligence) and Criminal Litigation. The talk focused on some of the most famous cases of terrorism and bomb blasts in recent years. He spoke about the people involved in these types of activities, who do not wish for the welfare of society. He elaborated on the techniques, used to hunt these hidden terrorists, which included infiltration, undercover, double agents, legal introspection, social media, analysis, CCTV footages, call details and debit and credit card transactions. Knowledge was imparted on the processes that help the police to nab terror suspects.

## TORTIOUS LIABILITY AND PROTECTION OF PERSONAL RIGHTS

A Session of Nyaya Samvada on "Tortious Liability and Protection of Personal Rights" was organized by Kristu Jayanti College of Law on February 23, 2019. The session was illuminated with the presence of the Hon'ble Justice K.N. Keshava Narayana, Former Judge, High Court of Karnataka and well-known Arbitrator. He analyzed the definition of Tortious Liability and explained that the objective of Tort Law is to ensure good behavior by curtailing 'wrong doing' in general institutions and even the public authorities representing State. Drawing from his rich experience as judge, he also commented on landmark judgments like Jay Salt Works, Common Cause Action; He also detailed concepts such as negligence which comes under tortious liability.



## DISTRIBUTIVE SOCIAL JUSTICE AND STRUCTURAL FUNCTIONALISM IN INDIA

A session was organized to impart knowledge on 'Distributive Social Justice and Structural Functionalism in India' on March 2, 2019. The eminent resource person was Dr. S. B. N Prakash, Adjunct Professor National Law School of India University, Bengaluru. He started the lecture by introducing the concept of distributive justice. It was the concept introduced by the Greek philosopher Aristotle. It simply means that the all the people of the society must accorded with the equal opportunities in every field. The resources available in the country must be distributed in such a way as to serve common good. There must not be any kind of distinction made for any citizen on the basis of religion, race, caste, gender and place of birth. He also highlighted the important of continuance of reservation system in India. The session ended with the queries asked by the students.



## ROLE OF ADVOCATE GENERAL IN PROTECTING THE INTEREST OF JUSTICE

An interactive session was organized Kristu Jayanti College of Law on December 12, 2018. Sri. Udaya Holla, Advocate General, Government of Karnataka, Chief Guest, spoke exhaustively about the role of Advocate General in protecting the Interest of Justice. He gave an introduction to the constitution, and the functions & powers of the Advocate General as mentioned in it. He informed that Article 105 of the Indian Constitution mentions the functions of the Advocate General. He enlightened the students on the history of the concerned position and their relation to the state functions of Advocate General. Further, he also spoke about the obligations and duties of the lawyer in protecting the interests of the justice. He went on to share his experience of striving for justice and arguing for the State on issues such as sharing of waters with neighboring states.

## COMPANY LAW AND LITIGATION

Kristu Jayanti College of Law organized an interactive session on 'company law and litigation' on November 3, 2018. The resource person was Sri. S. Vivekananda, Partner, VGB Associates, Bengaluru. He delivered an address on Company Law development and practice in India, where he traced the origins and development of Company Law and how it changed to suit Indian needs. An overview on the Companies Act, 2013 was also given. Sri. S. Vivekananda focused on the types of Companies, their unique features, and their feature of perpetual succession. He went on to explain how an advocate's role keeps varying in an entity like a Company. Overall, the session proved to be an extremely insightful and helpful in terms of understanding the Company Law in India and its working. It gave an insight to the law students regarding the overview of the Company Law.



## TORTUOUS LIABILITY UNDER MOTOR VEHICLES ACT

An interactive session was organized on 'Tortuous Liability under Motor Vehicles Act, 1988' on September 22, 2018. The resource person, Shri. Giridhar H, Advocate, High Court of Karnataka, Bengaluru, explained the importance of the law. With the increasing number of vehicles on road, the Act is gaining popularity with each passing day. He touched on various topics including the concepts of negligence and compensation, the importance of a driving license, insurance and third-party liability. The system of multiplier and multiplicand and its calculation so on and so forth. Sir also introduced the Motor Vehicles Act of 1988 and stated its importance in accomplishing social justice and how it impacted the parties especially the victim and their family.



## CRIMINAL LAW CASES

Kristu Jayanti College of Law organized an interactive session on 'Criminal Law Cases' on November 24, 2018. The resource person was Shri. George Kutty Jose, Associate Professor, School of Law, Christ University, Bengaluru. He spoke about how law students should build their confidence in their legal careers. He put forward hypothetical situations that made the students think about solutions, logical reason and how to come to the conclusion. He also stressed the importance of law students reading newspapers, judgments, and articles, as it would help to build legal career secure. He also spoke about the importance of lawyers until there is peace and harmony in our society.

## ARGUMENTS OF A CASE: A DEMONSTRATION

Kristu Jayanti College of Law organized an interactive session on October 27, 2018 to demonstrate the arguments of a case. The resource person was Shri. Abhirup Paul Bangara. Over 180 participants joined in on the talk which was informative and thought-provoking. After reminiscing about his experiences as a law student, Shri. Bangara, went on to the demonstration wherein students were called to volunteer and argue a case, on behalf of the plaintiff and the respondent and the judge's. The case had seven issues and students were asked to argue on it.

## PROCEDURAL LAWS IN COURT

In order to educate law students on the working of procedural laws in court, Kristu Jayanti College of Law organized an interactive session with Shri. Shivanagouda Doddamani, Advocate, High Court of Karnataka on August 18, 2018. He began his address with an introduction to the types of property-related cases, including injunction suits, declaration of title, partition suits, suits for easement rights and suits for specific performance. He explained about the four preliminary objects raised in the same, which includes jurisdiction of courts in various subject matters, non-payment of proper court fees, absence of a cause of action and the fact that certain documents are not admissible in evidence. Further he explained about the importance of a 'Vakalath Nama' and the restrictions imposed on it was discussed with reference to Section 126 of the Indian Evidence Act, which deals with disclosure of communications between the parties and the barristers etc. The session was very interactive and the students learnt how to venture into the field.



## JAYOTSAVA - BENGALURU ZONAL YOUTH FESTIVAL

Karnataka State Law University and Kristu Jayanti College of Law organized Bangalore Zonal Youth Festival on October 16 and 17, 2018 in Kristu Jayanti College. Dr P Ishwara Bhat, Vice-Chancellor of Karnataka State Law University, Hubballi, was the chief guest for the programme. The youth festival aimed to portray the artistic and cultural talents, develop competitive spirit, and collective synchronization among the participants. The chief guest motivated the participants of the cultural youth festival and appreciated Kristu Jayanti College of Law for being a gracious host and meticulously organizing the fest. The youth festival gave a platform for the students to exhibit their talents and creativity on a national level. The two-day cultural had various events under music, fine arts, theatre, dance and literary session enabling students to exhibit their prowess. Jayotsava -2018 enabled students to probe the layers of history and heritage and encapsulate the spirit and pulse of their time.

## KRITRIMA NYAYA VEDIKA SESSION ON THE JUDGMENT WRITING SKILLS

Kritrima Nyaya Vedika, an orientation session on the judgment writing skills with Ms. Meenakshi KKV, Research Associate, Rostrum Legal, Bengaluru was held on March 16, 2019. She started the session by sharing her experiences in mooting and judgment writing. The differences between 'judgment' and 'order' were clearly elaborated. A detailed discussion of the various steps involved in judgment writing, including Balancing of facts and evidence, understanding the facts, appreciating the evidence, hearing the arguments, reading the statute etc. ensued. She also explained the different contents of the case like name of the court, type of the case, number of the case, provision of the law, and parties to the case. The session gave students vital overview on an important aspect of the profession of law.

## NATIONAL LEVEL WORKSHOP ON INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY LAWS- PRACTICE AND PROCEDURE

A National level Workshop on Intellectual Property Laws - Practice and Procedure was organized by Kristu Jayanti College of Law in association with RK Dewan & Co. on October 31, 2018. The programme was inaugurated by Hon. Justice Shylendra Kumar, Retd. Judge, High Court of Karnataka and the Current Chairman of Fee Fixation Committee for private professional institutions. He spoke on how IP law has emerged to be the buzzword of the day and discussed important case laws such as the Novartis case and Gorbachev's case. Across four sessions, areas such as IP laws, Copyrights and Protection Laws, Geographical Indications, and Registration of Patents were expertly introduced and discussed by an eminent team of resource persons. Through these lectures and interactions, the students could acquire valuable knowledge on the topic.



## MOCK TRIAL

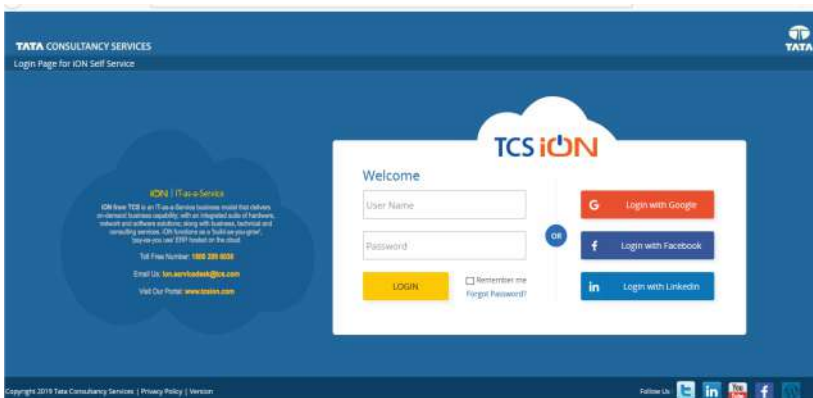
# CAMPUS MANAGEMENT SOLUTION

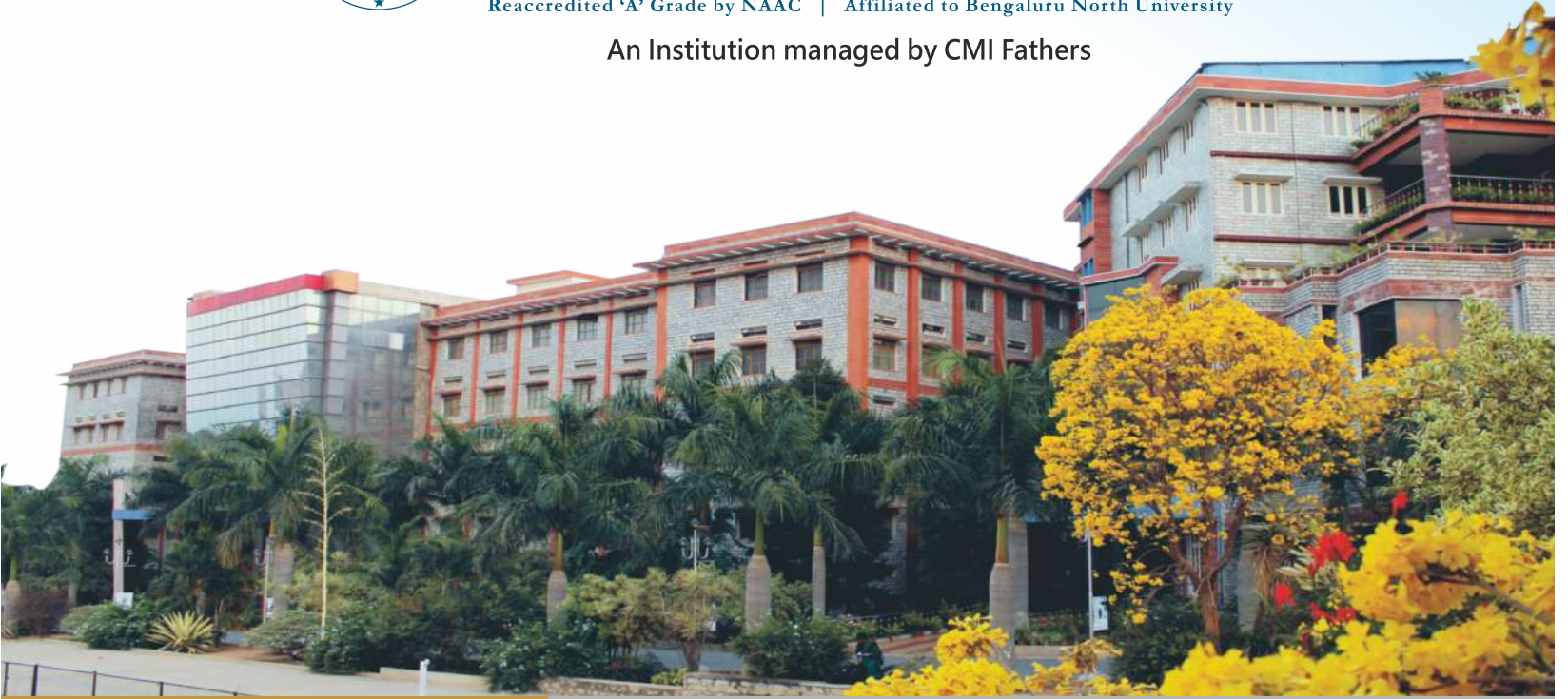
