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# Droupadi Murmu calls for women-led development at the 70th National Film Awards

The 70th National Film Awards took place, where the winners of different categories were honored by the President, Droupadi Murmu. The legendary actor Mithun Chakraborty was awarded the prestigious Dadasaheb Phalke Award 2024. Although the event was centered on finesse in art and cinema, it also delivered a socio-political message when the president urged more efforts toward women's achievement in motion pictures. This appeal stemmed from the fact that out of the 85 recipients of the award, only 15 were women.

She also highlighted how film and social media have an influence on changing society and asked to make efficient use of these platforms to advance gender equality and women's rights. Such a statement can be seen

as a general call for women's leadership across industries in India to increase women's representation in fields that are predominantly dominated by men, including cinema.

The awards also rewarded the newcomers and brilliant movies across genres and languages. For the MGR Sivajilingam Award for the Best Performance by an Actress in a Supporting Role, Manasi Parekh won for the Gujarati film Kutch Express, while Nithya Menon won the Best Female Actor Award for the movie Thiruchitrambalam. For the Hindi film 'Uunchai,' Sooraj R. Barjatya received the award for Best Director.

The Malayalam feature film "Aattam," directed by Anand Ekarshi, stood as the winner for the 'Best Feature Film' category.

Rishabh Shetty has bagged the Best Male Actor for his performance in the Kannada language movie "Kantara." Movies like "Kantara" and "Aattam" show how regional cinema is slowly beginning to gain national, and in some cases, international, attention due to the creativity they depict.

"Gulmohar" bagged the award for Best Hindi Film, while Niki Joshi received the award for Best Costume Designer for Kutch Express. Such accolades pay attention to the technical aspect of filmmaking, given that films are not only the artistic production of the actors, the director, or the screenwriter but are collaborative works of many talents. In the music category, the winners of the Arial-based Best Music Director were A. R. Rahman for the movie 'Ponniyin Selvan-Part 1' (Tamil).

Along with honoring cinematic accomplishments, the National Film Awards ceremony has also been used to discuss topical subjects and gender inequality in particular. President Murmu's plea for more development of the industry that is spearheaded by women also incorporated the general idea of the fight for gender parity in Indian society and other sectors as well.

## Delhi University approves the strategic plan 2024-27 for the betterment of education

The Delhi university's academic council on 10th October approved the revised strategic plan 2024-27 which was withdrawn in last year December followed by allegations of plagiarism from various institutions and universities.

As Ritu Rathee concluded her video, she remained hopeful that her fans would respect her call for privacy. Her decision to address the public was not to provide a detailed explanation of her marital issues, but rather to clarify misconceptions and unwanted sympathy that the couple does not need.



### RBI Boosts UPI Limits and Adds Name Verification for Safer Transfers

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) announced an increase in UPI123 and UPI Lite transaction limits on Thursday in an attempt to promote greater use of the Universal Payments Interface (UPI).

At the moment, UPI123 Pay has a maximum transaction limit of 5000 rupees. After consulting with stakeholders, the RBI has decided to raise the "per-transaction" limit to 10,000 rupees in order to increase usage.

Additionally, the RBI made the decision to raise the overall wallet limit from 2000 to 5000 rupees and the per-transaction limit on UPI Lite from 500 to 1000 rupees. Following the example of payment systems like UPI and IMPS, the banking regulator has decided to add a 'Beneficiary Account Name Look-

Up Facility' for Real Time Gross Settlement (RTGS) and National Electronic Funds Transfer (NEFT) systems.

This will allow the remitter to confirm the beneficiary's name before completing a payment transaction, which means when a person wants to transfer funds, they can see the name of the person they are sending the money to before the transaction is finalized.

This option can be easily compared to the features that are already present in other payment systems including RTGS and NEFT. This improvement has been introduced to help mitigate risks and enhance user security. The RBI hopes that more Indian users will choose UPI for transferring their funds in future.

### **Kuwait Fire Claims 49 Lives, Triggers Investigation**

The devastating fire in Kuwait tragically claimed the lives of 49 people, mostly Indian nationals from Kerala, Tamil Nadu, and various Northern Indian states.

The victims were mainly unskilled and semi-skilled workers who died from smoke inhalation and severe burns while sleeping in a building housing about 200 residents. The fire, sparked

by an electrical circuit, broke out in the kitchen of a six-story residential building in the Mangaf area of Southern Kuwait's Ahmadi State.

The Indian Ambassador Adarsh Swaika visited local hospitals, meeting the injured workers and victims and offering them support.
