Resource person, Ms. Roshnee Bhowmick, CSR Executive, Unicharm India spoke to the students about the importance of female reproductive system and gender specific awareness about 'Menstrual Health and Personal Hygiene'. In her talk, she mentioned the significance of regular exercise, proper diet and stress-free environment for proper reproductive health. She insisted the students to do regular exercises for their personal wellbeing and counselled the students on how to cope up with stress and mood-swings during the days of menstruation. 
'International Men's Day'- 19th November 2021

The competition provided a platform for students to express their talent and creativity.

Expert Lecture On Gender Sensitization in College Campus

To provide an integrated and interdisciplinary approach to understand the social and cultural constructions of gender that shapes the experiences of women and men in society, an expert lecture on gender sensitization was organized for the B.Com. students on 30th September 2021. Ms. Jacintha S Kumaraswamy, the resource person enlightened the students on Gender Sensitization and created an awareness, bringing forward the distinction between sex and gender whilst defining other gender related problems faced by women. She insisted on the importance of education and how it could change the mindset of the people. She said that in order to have a better understanding of the concepts of equality and non-discrimination one should have knowledge on gender roles, gender stereotypes, gender discrimination, gender based violence, masculinity, patriarchy, gender equality and so on. Her motivational talk dealt with curbing the gender biases prevailing in the society and to empower girls and women to achieve their goals. She aimed at sensitizing adolescent girls and boys towards existing gender inequalities and strongly encouraged gender parity.



Expert Lecture On Gender Sensitization in College Campus

An Expert Lecture on 'Gender sensitization in college campus', was organized by the Computer Science Department and Women Empowerment Cell of KristuJayanti College on 18th September 2021. 



The speaker for third keynote Session was Ms. Vidushi from Aweksha who spoke on the recovery, and personal


