Mr. Remy Lobo addressed perinatal mental health, highlighting conditions such as antenatal depression and postpartum anxiety, and the importance of timely interventions.

Students gained insights into the importance of gendersensitive approaches, maternal care, and the pivotal role of social workers in addressing these issues. Participants highly praised the program, noting its relevance and depth in preparing them to support vulnerable populations effectively. The program equipped them with the knowledge and tools to provide empathetic, evidencebased interventions, ensuring the well-being of mothers, families, and communities.



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
