The idea cluster pods (ICP's) is an initiative of Kristu Jayanti Incubation centre to create clusters comprising of students showing common entrepreneurial interests in business opportunities. The main aim of this programme is to motivate entrepreneurial desire of the students and to mentor him from the first step of idea creation till the last step of business development. The orientation programme for the year 2019 was initiated on 9-8-2019 by 12 Noon. The incubation centre works to ensure that the students become job creators and not job seekers. The objective of the ICP is to generate viable businessideas, fund and launch the idea and provide necessary support and assistance to the students during the processby giving them assistance from entrepreneurial mentors.Dr. D. Ravindran and Dr. M. Mathiyarasan organized the programme. The session started at 12 Noon and all the members of the entrepreneurship and innovation centre were a part of it. The welcome address was given by Dr. A. Muruganantham. He gave the students a brief idea about the incubationcentre and what are its objectives. Report of Workshop on "ENTREPRENEURSHIP"

Name and details of the Chief Guest: Mr. Amlan Bhattacharya, co-founder and director of Throttle PAD 2.0. Mr. Amlan addressed the students in a very interactive way stating the various opportunities to start a business and a ready plan for every situation.

Objective: To acquaint the students in getting a brief idea on how to become a successful entrepreneur and to keep a focus on how to position your products/services in the minds of the customers, for your own enterprise.

Brief Write up on the Programme: The one-day workshop on "idea generation" and business plan preparation" was organized by entrepreneurship and innovation center in association with Kristu Jayanti Incubation Centre. The workshop consisted of 4 sessions namely why entrepreneurship, funding and support, innovative ideas and business ideas and business plan preparation. The inauguration started at 9:30 am and a brief introduction of the workshop was given to the students by the chief guest. In the first session sir spoke about how entrepreneurship is different from a job and self-employment and highlighted the reasons as to why a person should opt for entrepreneurship. The second session was about funding and support. He discussed the 4 methods of funding consisting of angel investors and venture capitalists. During this session he encouraged the students to participate in business plan competition in various colleges and build their connections as the judges of such competitions are mostly investors or venture capitalists. The third session comprised of how an idea should be. He told the students that their idea should be innovative and not copied in order to be viable and valuable in the market. The last session was about business ideas and business plan preparation. During this session he spoke about the different steps in business plan preparation and discussed about diversification and transition.

Feedback: The feedbacks received by the participants for the workshop was brilliant. According to them the sessions were very resourceful and indeed motivated them to go ahead with their business ideas and generate a proper business plan. Feedback was taken in order to analyze the effectiveness of this Programme.
