



Objective:



The objective of the program was to observe and celebrate the world environment day in order to spread awareness among the citizens of the place.

Brief write up:

World Environment Day is the biggest international day for the environment. Led by the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), and held annually since 1973, it has grown to be the largest global platform for environmental outreach. It is celebrated by millions of people across the world.

Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister D.K.Shivakumar directed the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) to involve students for a tree plantation drive in the state capital at Rachenahalli lake.

While attending the function on the occasion of the World Environment Day, shivkumar asked the BBMP to prepare a report on how many roads in Bengaluru that do not have trees on either side of the roads. The responsibility of planting saplings and nourishing the trees should be given to local students.

"The BBMP should provide plants and protection meshes to them. The sapling should be named after the child who plants it and that child should take care of the sapling," Shivakumar said. He encourage to organize competition among school children which would help them happily come forward to plant and nurture trees. We should ensure the growth of trees like how we ensure the growth of our children. The Deputy Chief Minister asked officers of the horticulture department, forest department and BBMP to come out with a permanent plan. He also emphasized on the importance of maintaining greenery in the city by planning more trees.



Objective of the programme:

The objective of the programme was to set up the camp site to co-ordinate the activities in the coming days of the special camp. Objective of the programme:

The second day's activities were the introduction of the first-time camp attendees to the routine functioning of the NSS camp.

The volunteers of the teaching team were taken to their respective venues in order to introduce new and interesting methods of teaching along with creative presentation, while giving the volunteers exposure into the survice aspect of the teaching profession.

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A session on importance of Ayurvedic medicine was conducted with the resource person Dr. Mukthambika, an ayurvedic professional who enlightened the volunteers of the traditional practices of medicine in India, and its importance.

Cultural activities and games, an integral part of the camp experience, were conducted to create a rapport of understanding among the volunteers.

Brief write up on the programme:

The day started with the boy volunteers at 6:45 AM, who were assigned Shramdan activities in the early morning, in order to stimulate the mind and energize the mind, while doing social welfare. The girl volunteers arrived by 9:00 AM, and after breakfast, were assigned with the other volunteers to clean the surroundings of Ambedkar Bhavan and government school. These places, being the epicentre of social welfare programmes of the camp, should be kept in proper and hygienic condition for the smooth functioning of the activities.

The teaching team taught various lessons in Kannada and Hindi to students of various grades, and also conducted various cultural programmes for the children. The cleaning activities were followed by a session by Dr. Mukthambika, an eminent ayurvedic professional with over 25 years of experience in the field. Her session was lively and interesting, where traditional medicinal practices in India were explained in brief to enrich the volunteers' knowledge on the traditional medicines. The scope in ayurvedic medicine and yoga were briefly explained following by an exposition on the different aspects of ayurvedic medicine and its difference with western medicine. The session ended with Dr. Muthkambika giving some tips to the volunteer in maintaining their health. 'Chyawanprash' medicine was distributed to the volunteers.

In the evening, games and activities were conducted for the volunteers, which were stopped following heavy rains. The day ended with instructions from Dr. Shreedhar P.D. and the NSS and UBA coordinators Mr. H.V. Rishikesh, Ms. Pooja S and Ms. Shruthi M for the smooth functioning of activities for the next day.

Objective of the programme:

The objective of the day was to give awareness about legal aid in India, and thereby provide the villagers of Byatha Seeresandra with exposure to the legal environment. For this purpose, the Hon'ble Justice Jaishankar, and Justice Vignesh Kumar graced the camp site with their presence and provided an illuminating session at Sonnenahalli Gram Panchayat.

Brief write up on the programme:

NSS Co-ordinator Mr. H.V. Rishikesh led the by volunteers to the government school, beginning the walk at 5:45 AM. The girl volunteers joined the boys at the school by 6:30 AM and consequently, the volunteers were assigned specific areas surrounding the school and Ambedkar Bhavan to clean with the implements. The duties were assigned group-wise, with the 5 boy groups and 4 girl groups cleaning various specific areas around the village, including two temples and it surrounding areas. Following the Sharamdaan activity and the breakfast, the volunteers began a walk to the nearby Sonnenahalli village, where the main program of thee day.ws to happen. After reaching the gram panchayat and government school, the volunteers immediately began cleaning up the surrounding areas. The legal awareness programme was conducted in commemoration of National Legal Aid Day. The guest for the were Hon'ble Justice Jaishankar of Karnataka High Court, and Civil Judge Vignesh Kumar, and Dr. Mohan Rao Bolla, Principal, Kristu Jayanti College of Law. The guests provided an illuminating session to the villagers and NSS and UBA volunteers on property rights, land rights and access to justice for land cases in courts. Useful information regarding methods equitable justices was explained in simple terms for ease of understanding. This was followed by a interactive session between the villagers and the eminent judges. The villagers asked several questions from their personal experience in court and asked questions for public interest regarding land rights. The volunteers were involved in every aspect of the programme:

from emceeing to technical support and serving food to the chief guests and villagers. Meanwhile, the volunteers carried out the teaching activities in Kristu Jayanti CMI School as per the schedule. The volunteers later returned to camp site after lunch and stayed there due to heavy rain. In the evening, the teams came together to discuss activities that can be done as part of culturals in the following days. The volunteers have formed stronger bonds with their teams and achieved better co-operation with each other.


Another objective was to plan and strategize programmes in the coming days, which includes a eye camp for the benefit of the Byatha Residents.



Outcome:







All the volunteers were very excited for this activity, because we got to interact with children who were in primary school, their faces looked lit up as the volunteers donated stationary to them.





Computer Literacy Program (CLiP)-Practical Session-Enlighting with Education

Date: 25/01/2023

Objectives:

- to provide basic computer knowledge
- to improve student's skills in growing technology
- to eradicate illiteracy of computer knowledge

Brief Write Up of the Program:

Kristu Jayanti College (Autonomous) a member institution of the United Nations Academic Impact (UNAI) that has been chosen as the SDG Hub for Sustainable Development Goal 1: End poverty in all its forms everywhere came up with another venture to enlighten the community through education. Centre for Social Activities of Kristu Jayanti College started an evening study center as part of the new initiative of CSA named Computer Literacy Program (CLiP). Intending to eradicate illiteracy among the migrant floating construction workers in Kothanur and empowering them to secure a better place in society, CSA volunteers after their regular working college hours provided supplementary education to children from grade I-8 in two clusters. The volunteers through a survey conducted among the community of migrant floating construction workers identified the needy children and formed two clusters for providing them basic education. Most of the parents were illiterate and incapable of helping the children in their studies that affect the children's performance in school and let down their self-esteem which eventually led to the discontinuation of studies. The students were given individual attention and importance. They were thought on how to create Art using Software like Paint and Draw board on the Computer. Volunteers engaged themselves with the students to teach them more efficiently and interesting way. The program had a framework of three months' duration from December with four slots. In each slot, 30 trained volunteers were handling classes. They were helping out the children to do their basic computer handling skills and basic computer education and to revise the school lesson and in addition to that activities were conducted for the holistic development of children. The initiative had a great impact which helped to retain the children in school and the dropout rate has considerably reduced. Through this activity, CSA strived to uplift the underprivileged sections of the society by enlightening them through education and promoting self-confidence among the children.

Outcome: Promoting Self Confidence among Students.


Town, Kacharakanahalli, Udaya Nagar, Kempaegowda Layout, Ramamurthy Nagar to name a few.



Overview:




Brief Write up on the Programme:




Overview:




Objective: To inculcate the philia toward Wild Life conservation and comprehend the significance of Tiger Reserve and conservation activities.

Brief Write-up of the Programme:

The Centre for Environment & Sustainability organised a webinar on 'Our Tigers Return' on the 8th of March 2023 for students across all the deaneries to commemorate the World Wildlife Day. The Resource person of the day was Mr. Peeyush Sekhsaria, renowned geographer and writer. He is known for his conservation initiatives in the tiger reserves and documentation of the successful projects through illustrated books for children. The session began with a round of quiz about the interesting facts about Tiger population in India. The students were introduced to the alarming reduction level of tiger population in the remote forests due to illegal activities and hunting. He conversed primarly about the Panna Tiger Reserve which is located in Vindhyan Mountain range, Madhya Pradesh. The reserve serves as an abode to rich flora, fauna, and significant population of wild tigers. The reserve is also famous for its rich culture and heritage and home to several tribal communities. The reduction of tiger population distressed the native people and measures were drawn to regenerate their count. Mr. Peeyush demonstrated with pictures of how tigers were transported from nearing reserves for breading and the ways in which the areas were familiarized for them for breading purposes. The result of the operation admist the hindrances was successful as the count of the tiger population is beyond 200 in the present time. During the talk he instilled activism in the students with lines like 'Then do something – who is stopping you'. The puppet video of the journey of tiger population increase was screened in the end, followed by few questions






The activity also helped the society by impacting the life of those who live their lives in poverty, thus motivating to create a poverty free environment.

UBA volunteers Involved in Donation





Brief Write up on the Programme:







Brief Write up on the Programme:



The Medical Camp was sponsored by Muthoot Finance, Sri Krishnadeveraya Dental Hospital and Rotract Club of Golden Rock-3192.

The medical camp was a cornerstone of community healthcare outreach. The CSA volunteers were divided into groups to take up responsibilities of registration, informing the villagers about camp, arranging refreshment facilities for the doctors and supporting staff and so on. At the medical camp, the volunteers had arranged general check-up for villagers where free blood tests were taken and results were provided the same day. They had also organized eye check-up and dental check-up. At the eye camp, the doctor treated people and also provided spectacles for people in need and 79 villagers were benefitted through this

camp. At dental camp, the doctors treated people and further guided them about what precautions need to be taken or how it can be treated.

Outcome: Medical Camp was organized by various health organizations to provide basic medical facilities.

The program has been organized to provide assistance towards health related which was a part of the UNSDG GOAL 3 Good Health & Well Being.







Outcome: Encourage children to continue their education and reduce the number of school dropouts among children.



Objectives:

Brief write up on the Program:

The Rural exposure program has become an integral part of academic curriculum with 2 credits for the

students pursuing M.Com & M.Com FA. With this regard the Department of Commerce PG organized

a rural exposure program for 2 days with the theme "GRAMA SAMVEDITA" for the II semester

students to Nagayanna Koppli, Uthenahalli, and Janenahalli village, Shravanabelagola, Hassan District

on 25 March 2024 and 26 March 2024.

The students along with the elite team of faculty members, Dr. Pushpa A, Dr. Cherian Thomas, and Dr

Vidhya S; embarked their journey with full excitement and exuberant energy at 6.00 am on 25 March

2024. Students reached the place by 9:50 a.m. The students were divided into different teams for

different activities like Cooking & cleaning, Survey & Awareness, Activities and Tech team.

List of Activities conducted:

The first day of the program started with at 10:30 with activities, kids were invited for the competitions, for kids (musical chair, balloon games, knock the cups).

Simultaneously, as one of the purposes of the outreach program is to assess the impact of various government schemes on rural communities in Shravanabelagola, Hassan District, particularly in Nagayanna Koppli, Uthenahalli, and Janenahalli. The report focuses on four main topics: Women Empowerment (GRUHA LAKSHMI scheme), Unemployment (Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act), Education (Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan), and Farmers' Welfare. Through structured surveys conducted in these areas, the report aims to analyze the awareness, implementation, benefits, and challenges associated with these schemes. By examining the perspectives of residents, the report seeks to provide insights into the effectiveness of these initiatives in addressing socio-economic issues prevalent in rural Karnataka.

Trekking:

Students went on trekking the Chandragiri hill & Vindhyagiri hill in Shravanabelagola for swatchtha abhyan.

Competitions for the School Children:

On Day 1, Students visited Government School located at Nagayanna koppalu, and Few activities were conducted, and the winners were rewarded with prizes combo pencil box, water bottles, and colour pencils/ sketch pens etc.

Survey & Awareness:

The objective of this report is to assess the impact of government schemes on rural communities in Shravanabelagola, Hassan District. Topics covered include **Women Empowerment** (Gruha Lakshmi Scheme), **Unemployment** (MGNREGA), **Education** (Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan), and **Farmers** (Various Agricultural Schemes). Through surveys conducted in Uthenahalli, and Janenahalli, insights were gathered to evaluate scheme awareness, benefits, effectiveness, and challenges faced.

Two groups of students were sent to the villages to take a survey on the people awareness and information. Where the main source of income is from agriculture work that's 80% and some 20% are self-occupied. Their awareness of the government Benefits schemes – 80% of People were aware of Gruha Lakshmi, around 50% of Respondents knew about Education & Unemployment Schemes (few Respondents were aware but did not apply for it) And nearly 60% of Respondents were aware about

Various Agricultural Schemes. And most of the Respondents were given Awareness about **Gruha Jyothi Scheme** (Free Electricity up to 200units)

Cooking and Cleaning:

The ability to cook and clean effectively is often underrated but immensely valuable, students of KJC not only excel in academics and extracurricular activities but also demonstrate competence in essential life skills such as cooking and cleaning. This aims to shed light on the significance of mastering these skills, providing practical tips and insights for college students to navigate their way through culinary and household tasks, highlighting their proficiency, challenges faced, and strategies employed to maintain a balanced lifestyle.

In the realm of hospitality, the contribution of accommodation staff often goes unnoticed despite being essential to the comfort and well-being of guests, highlighting the significance of their support and goodwill during guests' stays and providing suggestions for expressing gratitude.

Organizing a final day lunch provides an opportunity to foster camaraderie, strengthen relationships, and convey appreciation for the dedication and professionalism of the staff, to share gratitude with accommodation staff is a meaningful gesture that fosters mutual appreciation, strengthens relationships, and leaves a lasting impression of hospitality and goodwill. Around 38 members has helped in cooking like washing and cutting vegetables etc. and they helped 4 times for 2 days. Cleaning: Around 8 to 10 members had helped in washing the utensils, 4 times for 2 days.

Learning Outcomes:

This rural exposure helped the students to develop both personal and professional skills and to enhance the self-development in process of planning, organizing, executing, recording and report writing on the Program



Impact Analysis:

The impact analysis revealed significant insights into the measurable impact of the extension activities on the community, neighborhood, and participants. Across the surveyed areas, it was found that a considerable percentage of residents had applied for various government schemes, including the GRUHA LAKSHMI scheme for women empowerment and the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA) for addressing unemployment. Participants reported tangible benefits from these schemes, such as regular receipt of scheme money and enhanced awareness of rights and opportunities. However, challenges persist, particularly regarding access to

educational resources under the Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan and effective utilization of farmer-centric schemes. Though, these initiatives positively influenced socio-economic dynamics, there remains a need for improved implementation and addressing challenges to maximize their impact on rural livelihoods and community development.






Outcome:





Impact Analysis:





To gain practical teaching experiences at different institutions and to provide a platform to interact with the community.


Brief write up on the Programme:

On Feb 15th and 16th February, 2024, I MA English students were involved in Extension Activity at Nethaji High School, Kanaswadi, Kannamagla Primary School, Kannamangala and Kristu Jayanti CMI Public School, Kannamangala. The aim was to provide a platform for the students to interact with the community, understand the needs of the community and also provide teaching exposure to the students with simultaneously leaving an impact on the young learners. On the first day 15th February, 2024, the students were warmly welcomed to the school assembly at Nethaji High School, Kanaswadi. The assembly brought back nostalgic memories for the students of their school days. The MA students were divided into groups and were allowed to interact with the students from Classes 1 to 9. The interactive sessions featured focus on topics like daily communicative skills in English, personal health and hygiene and social issues through dance, games and songs. 

Outcome:





items from college and distribute them to the school in order to benefit underprivileged children and provide them with aid in the near future.




Impact of the activity:

Objectives: The objective of observation visit is to provide a practical opportunity to the students to have an exposure to develop understanding of disability and the role of Social Work in dealing with. To enlighten the students with knowledge, experiences, and dynamics of fields of social work and to provide a brief idea about the methods, skills and techniques used in different setting of social work education.

Department of Social Work, Kristu Jayanti College, organized one day observation visit for MSW I year students for the session 2023-24. Two Organizations named MANNA Centre for Special Needs Children and Blessed Clare Special School for the mentally challenged were contacted and confirmed for the visit. The Observation Visit was planned and well executed by both faculties and students.

During visit to first organization MANNA Developmental Disability Centre for Special Needs Children is situated in Kothanur, Bengaluru. It is providing holistic development to children with special needs in Bangalore in the state of Karnataka. It is being established in the yer2011 and since then it is working for children with development disorders like Autism, Learning Disorders, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) and Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD). Session was started with an introduction by **Dr. Jonas Richard A Head of the Department. She focused on services to children with Autism, Developmental and learning

disorders. Interventions provided after screening and assessment. MANNA provides one to one as well as group interventions.

The project coordinator madam mentioned about all activities going by MANNA developmental Disability Centre. She talked about Applied Behaviour Analysis, Occupational Therapies, Speech Therapy, Social and Living Skills training and special education as well. She also encouraged the students of Social Work with her motivated words and actions. The session was ended up with question answer and with a vote of thanks given by the students.



They provide special education to the children, residential schools for mentally challenged girls, Physiotherapy and rehabilitation centre and women's hostel for the best growth and development of the Children.



engagement and honing skill sets. Cultural festivities infused the atmosphere with joy and provided a platform for local talents to shine, fostering unity.






Additionally, villagers received complimentary eye checkups, with those in need being provided with free spectacles.









Impact of the activity:





Name and details of the Resource Person: Dr. Juby Thomas

Objective:

- To encourage the migrants to rely on safe and clean drinking water sources
- To educate migrants on water purification techniques and providing necessary skillset to purify the water.

Brief Write-up on the Programme:

Kristu Jayanti College, Bengaluru, a UNAI hub for SDG: Goal 1 in India, in commemoration of the international day for eradication of poverty, organized a two day campaign on #Sip right, live bright to educate the migrant laborers in the city on the necessity of utilizing clean water sources. The campaign which began on 16th October at multiple migrant settlements was concluded with a special orientation program for the migrant children on 17th October at 4.30. The campaign was an outcome of a remarkable endeavor undertaken by sixty postgraduate students of the college, in their ongoing efforts, to make a difference at the grassroots level. With a commitment to understanding, advocating, and initiating dialogue, these students have taken up the challenge of addressing the often-overlooked plight of internal migrants in India. Recognizing the complexity of poverty and migration in India, these students adopted a multifaceted approach that combines research, advocacy, and dialogue. In the preliminary stage, students conducted several researches to identify the core issues at different migrant settlements. "In our study, we delved into the portability of drinking water, and the findings are quite concerning. Shockingly, in our initial tests, most of the water samples we examined were contaminated," opined Ms. Sharon Mary, II-year MSc Microbiology student. The students' passion and commitment to their projects are not only a testament to the power of education but also a shining example of how young individuals can drive positive change in society. In the second phase, the students designed awareness campaigns based on the research findings. "In light of their extensive field observations and in commemoration of the International Day for the Eradication of Poverty, our students executed a campaign to empower the migrant laborers to access and effectively utilize safe and clean water sources. This initiative seeks to educate migrants on purifying water independently, by employing the sand filtration method & boiling or solar disinfection," opined Dr. Augustine George CMI, Principal, Kristu Jayanti College. Through live demonstrations, students explained to them the usage of each element and encouraged them to utilize these purifying mechanisms. The campaign also encouraged the participants to utilize the state government kiosks for drinking water, as the government takes utmost care in providing drinking water with affordable rates.

The campaign adhered to the key aims of **SDG 1 No Poverty and SDG 6 Clean Water and Sanitation**, which reiterated the need to work for the betterment of the underprivileged people in the immediate community by imparting them with knowledge and basic life skills.

Programme Impact:

The campaign provided 59 postgraduate students from various multidisciplinary backgrounds with a unique experiential learning opportunity. These students were empowered with knowledge and skills related to the water purification process. As a result of the campaign, the students successfully brought attention to this critical issue. The campaign encouraged migrants to choose reliable and uncontaminated water sources over potentially hazardous alternatives, thereby reducing health risks. The efforts of the students were recognised and publicised by two national dailies, several vernacular newspapers and in the UNAI hub newsletter, which highlighted the problems identified by the students and the solutions they proposed. This not only raised awareness but also showcased the impactful contributions of the students through the campaign.





Objectives:

- To educate security and housekeeping staff about the importance of mental health, helping them recognize mental health as a vital part of overall well-being and reduce.
- To train participants to identify early signs of stress, anxiety, and other mental health challenges, both in themselves and in their colleagues, to promote timely support and intervention.
- To provide information on practical coping techniques and self-care practices that staff can use to manage stress, anxiety, and other common mental health challenges they may face in the workplace.
- To encourage open communication and support within the workplace, fostering a culture where mental health challenges can be openly discussed and support networks are encouraged.
- To inform participants about available mental health resources, such as counseling services, crisis hotlines, and support groups, so they can seek help when needed and encourage others to do the same.

Brief Write up on the Programme:

The "Manovikas" Awareness Programme on Mental Health was organized by Karnataka Civil Defence Corps of Kristu Jayanti College, Bengaluru, aimed at supporting the mental well-being of security personnel and housekeeping staff. Held on October 26, 2024, in the H1 Auditorium, the session was led by Ms. Ambika Avadam, a consultant psychologist from Swasthmind & Manonetra. This initiative focused on raising awareness about mental health issues, equipping participants with knowledge on stress management and coping mechanisms, and fostering a supportive work environment. The program emphasized the importance of mental health for frontline staff and offered resources to help them maintain emotional resilience in their daily roles.

Outcome:

• Participants gained a foundational understanding of mental health and its impact on overall well-being, enabling them to recognize the importance of mental health care in their personal and professional lives.

- Through practical tips and guidance provided during the program, participants learned healthy coping strategies to manage stress and maintain mental balance, which can improve their job performance and reduce burnout.
- By addressing common misconceptions and breaking down stigmas, the program encouraged open conversations about mental health, creating a more accepting and understanding atmosphere within the workplace.
- Participants were made aware of mental health resources, such as counseling services and helplines, empowering them to seek professional support when needed and to encourage others to do the same.

Feedback:

- Participants appreciated the practical coping strategies shared during the session, mentioning that the tips were easy to understand and implement in their daily lives.


Objectives:

Number of beneficiaries: Public and Smokers residing at Narayanapura


Objectives:






ABHA ID creation by NSS volunteers




Jayantian Extension Service – UNNATH BHARATH ABHIYAN organized a comprehensive educational session on menstrual health, Understanding Menstrual Health Together at Sri Sidhartha Sanivasa High School, a government school in Kothanur on November 5th, 2024. The aim of this activity was to bring knowledge about the Menstrual Health among school children. It also aims at conducting studies on social, economic, or environmental issues that affect rural children in the

government school, contributing to academic knowledge. This covered essential topics such as the basic understanding of menstruation and the menstrual cycle, the importance of hygiene during menstruation to prevent infections and health complications, and practical tips for managing menstruation, including the use of sanitary products and safe disposal methods. To ensure the session was engaging and memorable, several interactive activities were organized, which reinforced the concepts presented and allowed the young participants to feel comfortable discussing menstrual health in a group setting. These activities were met with enthusiasm, making the information relatable and accessible. The event concluded with a feedback and Q&A session, providing students the opportunity to clarify doubts and ask questions in a supportive, judgment-free environment. Overall, these comprehensive efforts successfully empowered the students with knowledge and confidence, contributing to their overall well-being and promoting a positive and informed perspective on menstrual health. Overall, the Activity was successful with volunteers visiting the school and giving children knowledge about Menstrual Health. Teachers and student Coordinators encouraged the volunteers and helped to complete the activity successfully.

IMPACT ANALYSIS:

- The program empowered 80 students with essential knowledge about menstrual health, promoting hygiene and breaking myths and stigmas.
- Interactive activities and open discussions fostered a supportive environment, enhancing understanding and comfort around menstruation.



Brief Report on the Visit:




Report on the Programme:


